

Major Transfer Map (MTM) Process: Participation, Collaboration and Accountability

∳T₽ Transfer Council **Commission Commission Public Institutions**

- In consultation with the Council, identifies subject areas for alignment
- In consultation with institutions, the Commission identifies participating CCs and universities
- Creates and charges faculty subcommittees to carry out alignment work
- Oversees MTM development and recommends completed MTMs to Commission for final approval
- The Commission approves or rejects recommendations from the Transfer Council
- IDs lack of timely progress and can force the completion of pathways

- **Public instititions** required to offer the adopted pathways
- May appeal to Transfer Council for exemption if they can prove a program does not fit a specific pathway

"Results from the 2023 Transfer Council Survey on CCN, Core Transfer Map (CTM), and Major Transfer Map (MTM) Implementation again demonstrate the need for an online student transfer portal with features such as uniform course numbers, information about how credits will transfer for students, costs of transferring credits, and assistance for students on requirements for academic programs, degree programs, and career paths. Survey respondents specifically mentioned the need for such a web platform."
