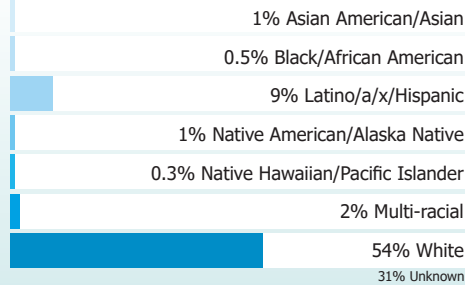

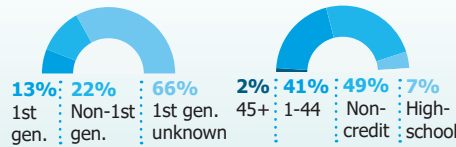

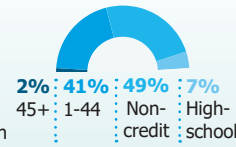


Students of color are increasingly represented on campuses. Currently, **15%** of COCC students identify as students of color.

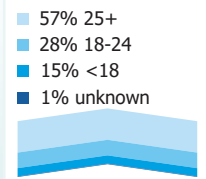
### 1st-Generation Status



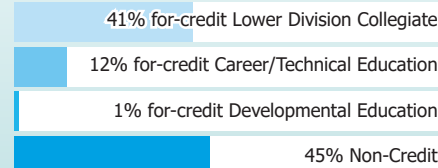

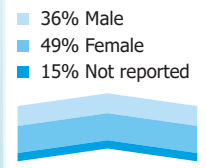

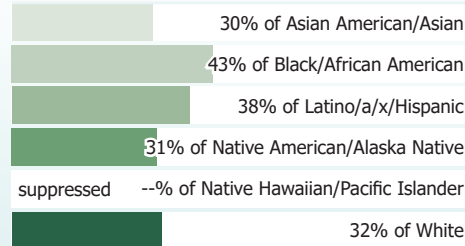

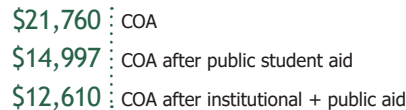

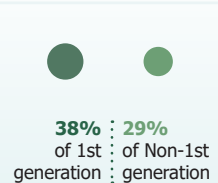
### Unable to Meet Expenses with Expected Resources



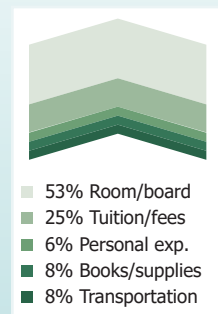
### Average Cost of Attendance (COA)



### Time to Completion Increases Cost



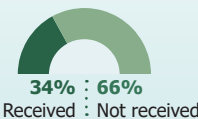

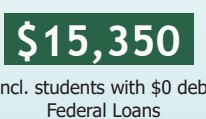
### Students Receiving Financial Aid

### Average Debt Among Graduates



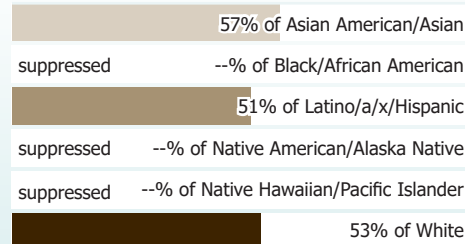
Loans fill the gap between costs and resources. **51%** of undergraduates have federal loans. Graduation rates increase with grants and decrease with loans.

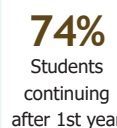

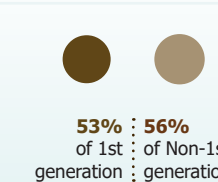
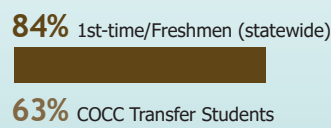
### Completion Rates



### Retention Rate

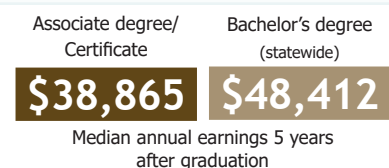


### Bachelor's Completion Rate if continued to junior year
