



Public Institution Enrollment: Fall 2024

Across all public institutions, enrollment rose 3% this fall, compared to 2023, with differences by sector and institution

Community College

The number of learners at community college is higher in 2024 than in 2023 (90,961), rising 4.3%. This continues the upward trend of last year. Enrollment rose at 12 of the 17 colleges.

The number of full-time equivalent students (**FTE**) is **also higher** in 2024, at 21,897, than in 2023 (20,460). This is a 7.0% increase.

Enrollment has risen in the last two years, though it **remains lower than pre-pandemic levels**. The number of students in fall 2024 is 17.6% lower than in fall 2019 (115,104 learners). FTE enrollment is 14.2% lower than in fall 2019 (25,523).

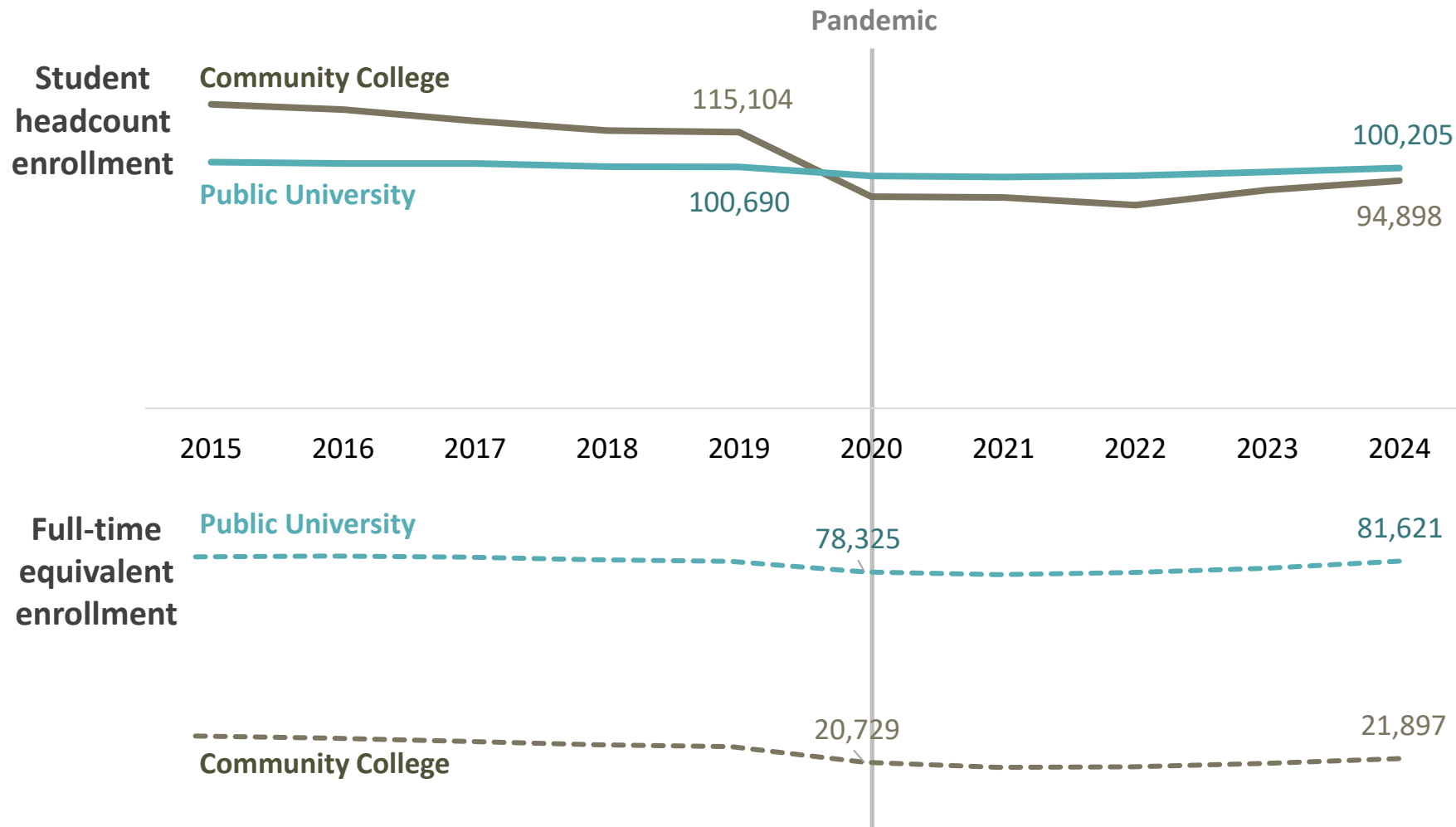
The number of public university learners is slightly higher in 2024 than in 2023 (98,545), rising 1.7%. This continues an upward trend since 2022. Enrollment rose at 4 of the 7 universities.

The number of admitted undergraduates is 1.5% higher; the number of admitted graduate students is 1.8% higher.

FTE enrollment is also higher, at 81,622, which is a 2.7% increase from 2023 (79,495).

Enrollment at universities is now close to pre-pandemic levels. The number of students is 0.5% lower in 2024 than in 2019 (100,690 learners), and FTE enrollment is 0.1% higher than in 2019 (81,520).

The long-term trend shows the decline during the pandemic and the more recent increase



In fall 2024, total enrollment at the colleges and universities continued the increase seen in the last 2-3 years.

Full-time equivalent enrollment also rose in both sectors in 2024.

Fall 2024 enrollment is similar to pre-pandemic levels at the universities and remains lower than pre-pandemic levels at the colleges.

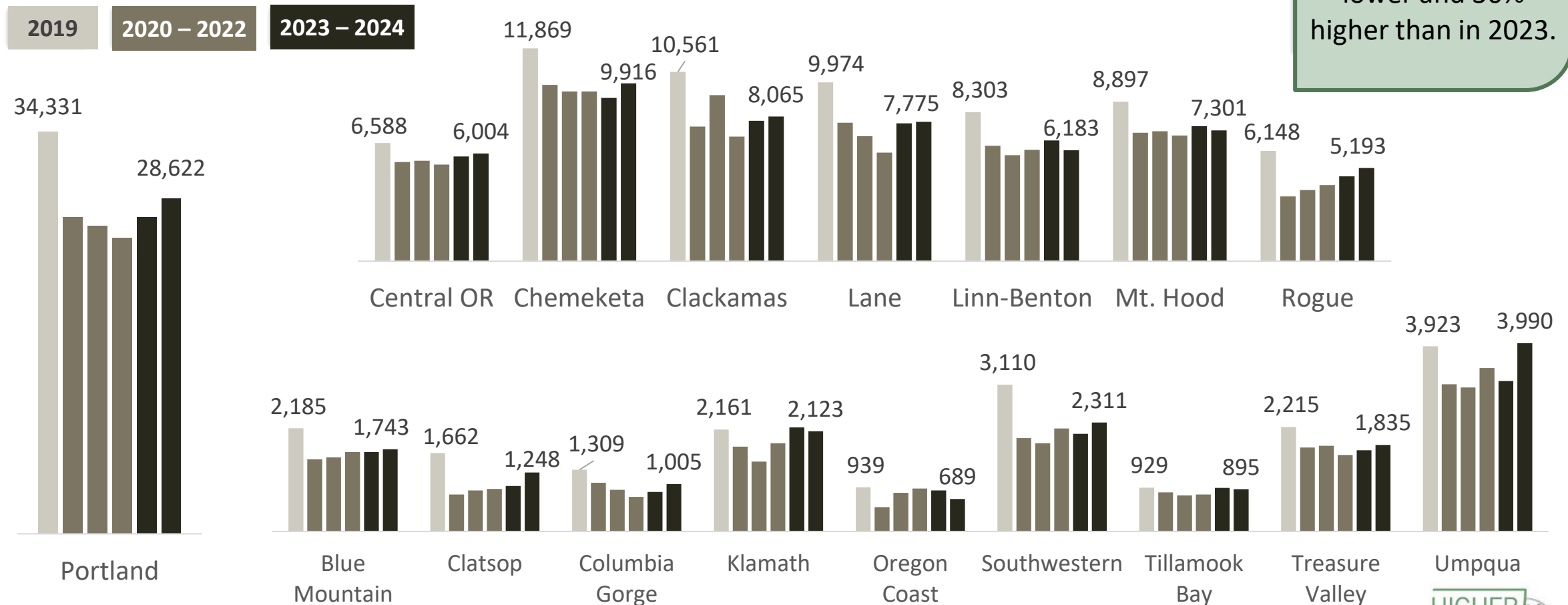

At community colleges, headcount enrollment rose at 12 of the 17

Across the colleges, the number of students in 2024 was between 21% lower and 30% higher than in 2023.

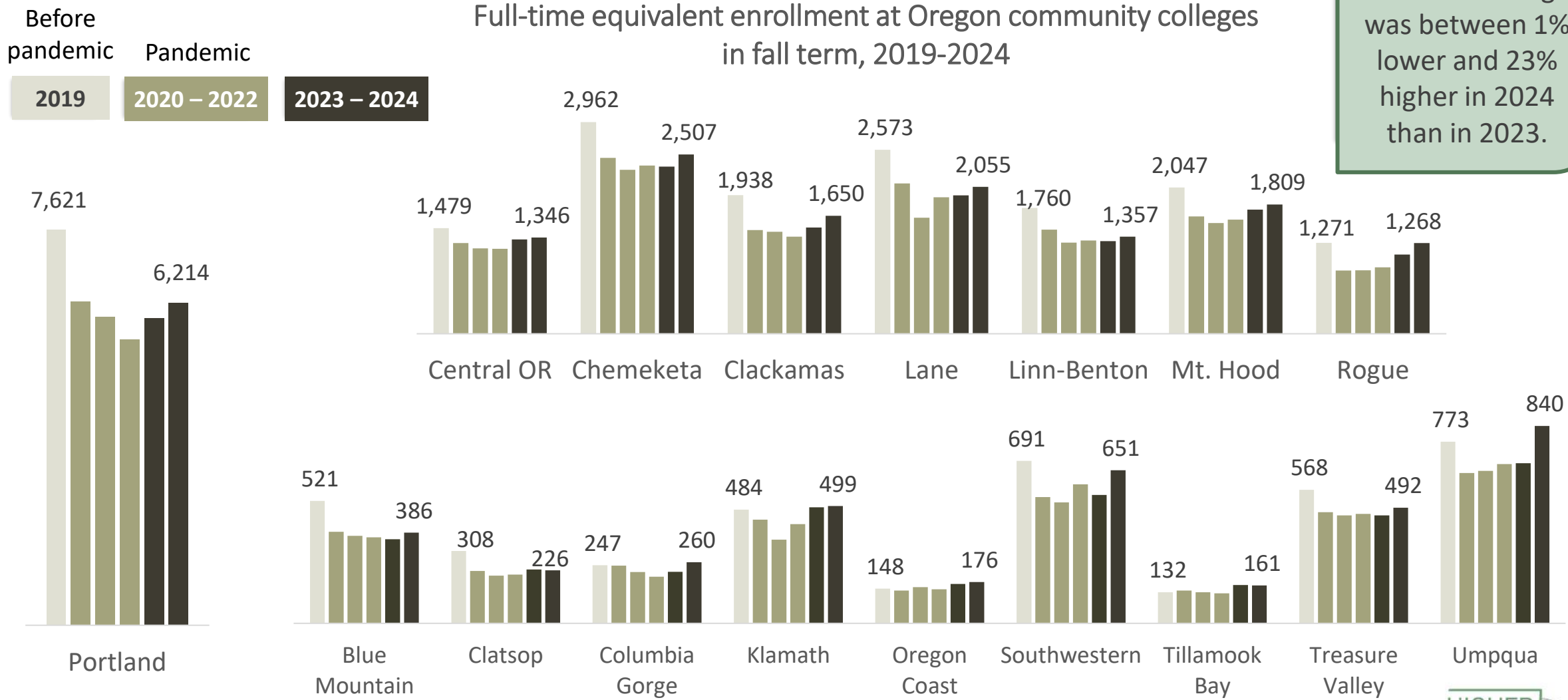
Total number of students at community colleges in fall term, 2019 to 2024

FTE enrollment across the colleges was between 1% lower and 23% higher in 2024 than in 2023.

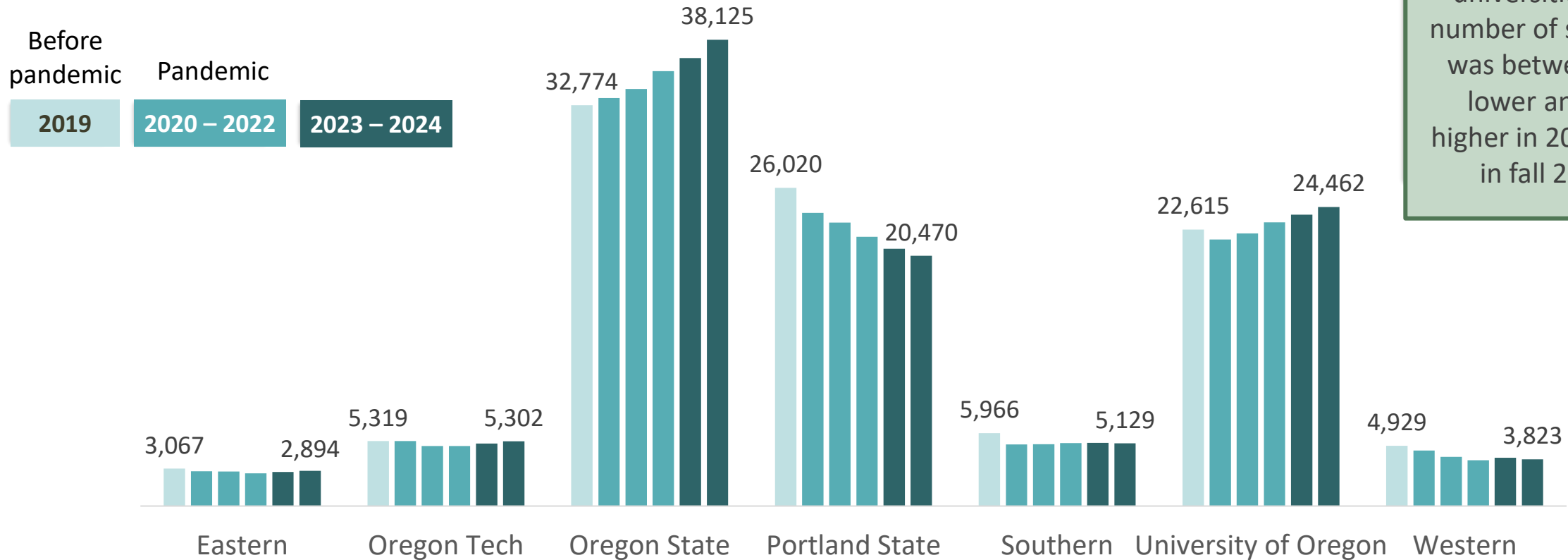

Total number of students at public universities in fall term, 2019 to 2024

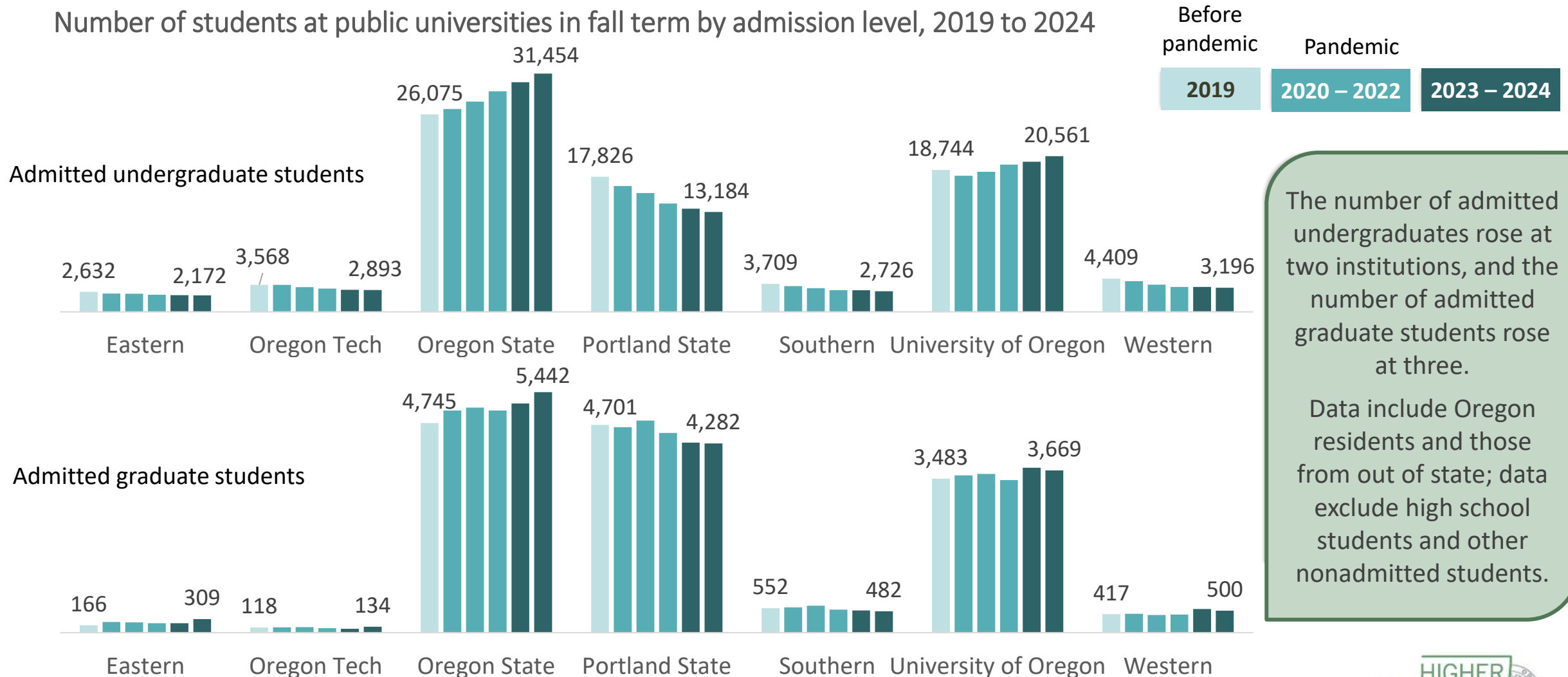


Across the universities, the number of students was between 3% lower and 4% higher in 2024 than in fall 2023.

Statewide, the number of admitted undergraduates rose 1.5 percent, and the number of admitted graduate students rose 1.8 percent

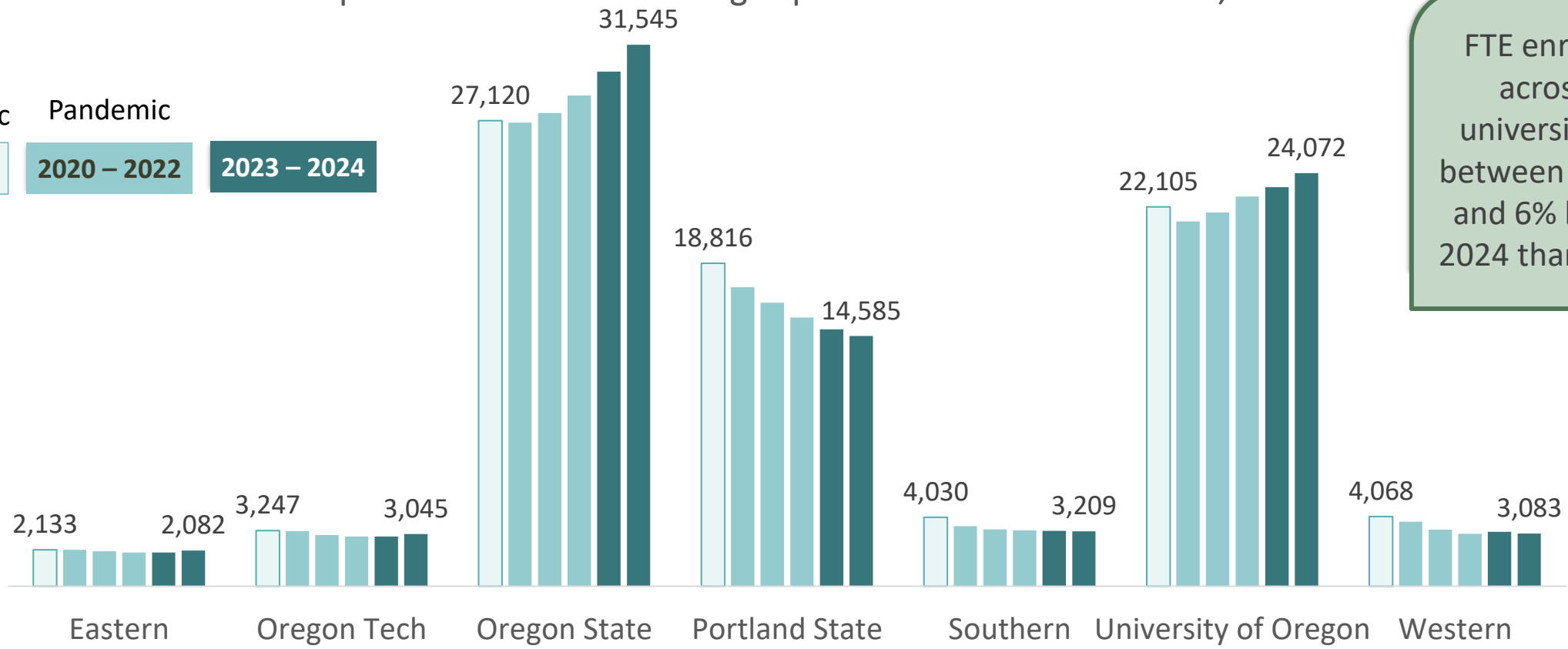

Key takeaways for fall 2024

The total number of students enrolled at Oregon public universities and community colleges rose 3% in 2024. This year's increase continues the upward trend of total statewide enrollment seen last year.

In the community college sector, headcount enrollment rose 4.3%, though not all colleges saw increases.

The increase at Oregon community colleges is the same as the national trend, also 4.3%.¹

In the public university sector, headcount enrollment rose 1.7%, though not all universities saw increases.

The increase at Oregon public universities is on par with the national trend of 1.9%.¹

At the community colleges, enrollment remains lower than it was before the pandemic.

At the public universities, enrollment is now about the same as it was before the pandemic.

At both colleges and universities, full-time equivalent enrollment also rose, and the increase is greater than for the number of students. This indicates that students are taking more classes, on average, than in 2023.
