

Voting in Oregon

Oregon has a proud tradition of open, accessible and fair elections, with a modern vote-by-mail system that is the gold standard in U.S. elections administration. Your vote is your voice in how our federal, state and local governments should run. With some of the highest voter turnout in the country, Oregonians are voters!

WHO CAN VOTE?

You can vote if you are:

18+

Over the age of 18



A U.S. citizen

*Note: Felons who are currently in prison are not eligible to vote.
You can register to vote at 16, but you will not receive a ballot until you are 18 years old.*

HOW TO VOTE?

1.

Register to vote.

Registering to vote in Oregon is quick and simple. Register online at [Oregonvotes.gov](https://oregonvotes.gov), by mailing in a voter registration card. Call us at 503-986-1518 with any registration questions.

2.

Get your ballot in the mail.

A few weeks before the next election, your ballot and voter pamphlet will arrive in the mail. An online translated voters' pamphlet in over a dozen languages will be available at oregonvotes.gov/VotersPamphlet.

3.

Fill out your ballot, marking your choices for candidates and ballot measures. You can skip races or fill out the entire ballot. Put the ballot in the included return envelope and sign the back of the envelope.

4.

Return your ballot by putting it back in the mail or putting it into an official drop site. You don't even need a stamp! You can find a drop site near you at [Oregonvotes.gov/dropbox](https://oregonvotes.gov/dropbox) or by calling 503-986-1518.
