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In addition to these individual grants, DLCD managed an \$54,900 contract that resulted in updates to the development code and three technical assistance grant agreements totaling \$35,900 for the cities of Detroit and Gates (Mid-Willamette Valley Council of Governments), Lane County, and Lincoln County related to the 2020 Oregon Wildfires.
