

## Rulemaking Guiding Principles

**Cultural areas generally** 

- Improve awareness of and reduce impacts to culturally important areas around the state
- Respect permitting timelines in Oregon law
- Support Governor's housing production objectives

## Charge

### 2024 Rulemaking

- Use local development permits as a point of contact to inform the public of existing state laws
- Require proactive measures to protect archaeological objects and sites of archaeological significance, as defined by state statute
- Define and protect landscape areas of cultural significance
- Provide direction for keeping information on archaeological sites and other select significant sites confidential

#### Building on the 2024 rule (2025)

- Reconsider what parties can directly bring an application to include a culturally significant landscape feature on a local comprehensive plan
- Reconsider how (e.g., quasi-judicial or legislative)
- Better define roles for Metro Urban Growth Boundary Expansions

- At least 18,000 Years
- SB 100, Original Comprehensive Plans
   Developed During Termination Era
- Inventories Developed During that Time
- No Division 23 Rules Implementing Cultural Areas

## Responses to 2025 Charge

## Who Can Bring an Application for Consideration

Cities and counties must receive and process applications for culturally significant landscape features

- 2024 rule Any individual or group could bring an application
- 2025 draft Restricts pathway to Oregon-based governments
- Other entities may still petition a local government to initiate

## Processing an Application

Discretionary review pathways - Legislative and Quasi-Judicial

- Strawberry Hill 4 Wheelers v Benton County Board legal precedent
- No changes

## Metro Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) Amendments

## The draft rule requires:

- Metro to send notice to tribes of a proposed UGB amendment
- Cities within Metro will continue coordination to apply Goal 5 when a culturally important landscape feature is noted in the record



## **Key Dates**

- Consultation and public comment through October 31, 2025 11:55 pm
- Commission deliberation and possible adoption December 4-5, 2025
- Effective date: January 1, 2027



## **Preparing for Implementation**

#### **DLCD**

**Templates** - Information on inadvertent discovery to be included on application forms

- Model language for notice procedures
- Support for LCIS List for each jurisdiction of Tribes that wish to be notified
- Guidance Local government / Tribal communication and coordination

### **Local Governments**

- Prepare for notice requirements
- Modify application forms
- Prepare to integrate responses and including recommendations in permits
- Prepare to receive applications to recognize a culturally significant landscape feature

#### **Tribes**

 Respond to invitation to define areas of interest

## **Legislative Commission on Indian Services**

Collect areas of interest

# Potential adjustments

- Move "where both are present" in definitions of cultural areas to guidance [Section 1]
- Clarify relationship between archaeological sites and Goal 5 inventories [Section 3]
- Clarify relationship to owner consent statute for historic resources in ORS 197.772 [Section 4]
- Reflect legislative adjustments to limited land use decisions [Section 5]
- Respond to comments from SHPO [Section 7]
- Note that National Scenic Area statute and rules prevail [TBD on Section/ Guidance]
