As of fall 2024, Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians regained ownership of 27 acres of their ancestral homelands at Cape Foulweather. The Tribe owns and manages the property for its ecological and cultural values.

Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians will acquire this 42-acre beachfront property located on the central coast of Oregon, an area of historic tribal villages and settlements within the Tribe's original reservation. The Tribe will own and manage the land for its ecological and cultural values.

Coquille River

Conserving Tidal Wetlands in the Coquille River

OR Dept. of Fish & Wildlife \$2.1 Million Award

This project will protect 528 acres of tidal wetlands - a high priority ecosystem - along the Coquille River on Oregon's southern coast. ODFW will purchase the property, as an addition to the Coquille Valley Wildlife Area, and steward the land in perpetuity.
