## Coastal Project Notice

Date: July 23, 2019

**NOTICE** is hereby given that the Department of Land Conservation & Development (DLCD), as provided in Section 307(c) of the Coastal Zone Management Act, is reviewing the following federal activity for consistency with the Oregon Coastal Management Program (Program).

### **FEDERAL AGENCY/AUTHORITY/PERMIT:**

- U.S. Army Corps of Engineers /Authority-Section 404 of the Clean Water Act/ Section 10 & 14, Rivers and Harbors Act; Corps of Engineers Permit #NWP2017-041.
- Federal Energy Regulatory Commission/Authority-Section 3(a) of the Natural Gas Act; FERC Docket #CP17-494-000 and #CP17-495-000

**PROJECT LOCATION:** The Jordan Cove Liquefied Natural Gas export terminal would be located on the North Spit of Coos Bay, near North Bend, Coos County, Oregon. The Pacific Connector Gas Pipeline would originate outside of the Coastal Zone near Malin, Klamath County and terminate at the facility. Approximately 53 miles of the pipeline are in Oregon's coastal zone. The terminal is located at: 43.432238, -124.267136.

**PROPOSED PROJECT:** The project would construct a 7.8 million ton per annum (mtpa) natural gas liquefaction and deep-water export terminal capable of receiving and loading ocean-going LNG carriers, in order to export natural gas.
