- Promote environmental stewardship

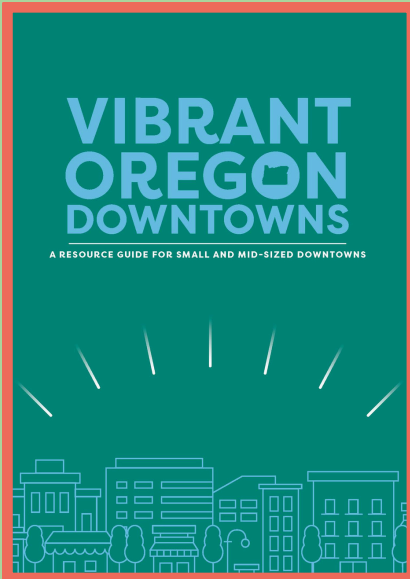


EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

TGM provides consultants to facilitate community discussions and write short memos on transportation and land use issues. Projects typically highlight a range of possible local solutions so the community can select one for further analysis and refinement.

RECENT OUTREACH PROJECTS

Examples of recent projects include Yachats City Center parking management plan, Lexington multi-modal safety project, Vibrant Oregon Downtowns resource book, The Dalles downtown land-use, housing, and transportation visioning, future growth opportunities planning for the City of Keizer, and the Traditional Housing Choices Guidebook.

Oregon's Transportation and Growth Management Program supports community efforts to expand transportation choices. By linking land use and transportation planning, TGM works in partnership with local governments to create vibrant, livable places in which people can walk, bike, take transit, or drive where they want to go.

IS TGM EDUCATION AND OUTREACH RIGHT FOR YOU?

Below are some questions to consider when determining if TGM Education and Outreach is the right service for your community.

Are you trying to determine community needs and priorities to inform a land use and transportation planning project?

Education and Outreach services help with information-gathering to identify land use and transportation planning options across a variety of transportation-related issues, including but not limited to:

- urban design supporting vibrant, walkable, livable, neighborhoods and downtowns
- housing choices and design
- the costs of different growth patterns
- parking management

Do you have a transportation-related educational event or forum that could benefit from financial support?

TGM Education and Outreach sponsors conferences and speakers to teach targeted audiences, as well as the general public, how to improve transportation options and community livability.



WHO CAN APPLY

To apply, elected leaders submit a letter of interest to TGM indicating interest and what topics they would like covered. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. Participating communities are asked to provide a location for the workshop, identify key issues to be addressed, provide background information, advertise the workshop, and give input on presentation materials and follow-up memos.

PROJECT TIMELINE

An Education and Outreach project may be initiated approximately 5 months from when an application is received. Once underway, a typical project lasts three to six months.
