

Project Goal and Working Group Role

Project Goal

Develop recommendations for the adoption and implementation of a modernized housing planning system, addressing affordable and market-rate housing production, into state and local planning programs.

Working Group Role

Advise and ground truth to ensure resultant legislative recommendations are implementable.

Meeting Outcome

Solicit <u>feedback on major issues</u> the project team will consider in the development of a "problem statement"

Survey Overview

Scope of the Goal Statement: Generally, on the right track but disagreement on the specifics (too broad vs too narrow)

(Summary for reference) Prepare legislative recommendations for the adoption of a modernized housing planning system, addressing affordable and market-rate housing production. The system will:

- Advance fair housing and center equitable housing outcomes
- Consistent system of measuring housing need
- Create organizational capacity
- Shared responsibility and accountability

Survey Overview

Achieving Fair Housing Outcomes: Reconciling a need to focus on equitable outcomes for BIPOC communities and limitations of land use planning

Top Issues

- 1. Establishing realistic and productive accountability mechanisms
- 2. Addressing underproduction and affordability
- 3. Responding to un- and under-addressed dimensions of need
- 4. Clearly articulating responsibilities of state, regional, & local gov't
- 5. Directing state agencies to orient investments and resources



Discussion Questions

- 1. Are there **critical issues missing** from the implementation issues list?
- 2. Are there issues on that list that should be addressed in another process or at another time?
- 3. What issues will be most important for the project team to focus on to ensure this process is successful?

Topic Areas

Ordered to ensure adequate time for discussion of high ranking topic areas:

- 1. Realistic and Productive Accountability
- 2. Affordable, Fair and Equitable Housing Outcomes
- 3. Shared Responsibility
- 4. Directing and Coordinating Resources
- 5. Region-Specific Issues
- 6. Administration of a RHNA

Realistic and Productive Accountability

- 1. Establishing realistic incentive and enforcement tools to ensure accountability
- 2. Administrative or regulatory structures needed to address housing needs for all Oregonians
- 3. Expectations for local, regional, and state entities in addressing need
- 4. Tracking progress towards goals and accountability structures for market and affordable housing

Affordable, Fair, and Equitable Housing Outcomes

- 1. Responsibility to address housing needs for historically underserved communities (e.g. communities of color, people with disabilities, and homelessness)
- 2. Addressing patterns of residential segregation by race and income and access to housing
- 3. Educate and build capacity in local, regional, and state governments
- 4. Recommendations to address tribal housing need

Shared Responsibility

- 1. Structuring allocation to reflect a shared responsibility and address racial/economic segregation
- 2. Historic actions and policies effect on current responsibility
- 3. Addressing future trend impact on housing need and distribution
- 4. Planning housing type, mix, quantity, and characteristics
- 5. Clarifying responsibilities in urban, unincorporated areas
- 6. Cities smaller than 10,000

Directing and Coordinating Resources

- 1. Partnerships and coordination of local, state, and federal funding to accomplish HB 2003 intent
- 2. Needed revenue and timeframe, including tenant support vs new construction
- 3. Addressing infrastructure finance and investment at state and local levels to support affordability

Region-Specific Issues

- 1. Integration with Metro regional land use framework
- 2. Relationship between Metro and satellite cities
- 3. Needed data resources to align RHNA boundaries with local constructions of regions
- 4. Methods to develop regions that better reflect the Central Oregon and Southern Oregon Coast regional housing markets
- Addressing specific contextual local needs
 (e.g. student population and second home demand)
 - 1. Critical Issues Missing 2. Another Process/Time 3. Most Important

Administration of a RHNA

- 1. State or regional agency(ies) implementing the RHNA
- 2. Changes in inherent or delegated authority for agencies
- 3. Optimal frequency for completing the RHNA Align with Housing Production Strategies (HPS), the Housing Needs Analysis (HNA), and the Metro Regional Framework Plan
- 4. Appropriate timing and process for amending the methodology
