
APPENDIX 8. RESPONSES TO SUMMIT RECOMMENDATIONS

Q1 Recommendation: Explore support for a shared digital content system in Washington and Oregon, possibly based on the Washington Rural Heritage project. The goal of a regional system would be to include content from throughout the region, working with a diverse set of institutions. Additionally, the system could be used to host digital collections that are considered to be "at risk" due to limitations at the local level, although the primary purpose of the system would be access, not preservation. Another element of such a system would be expanded training opportunities around digital content and digitization for all interested institutions.
