









#### The Beverly Cleary Children's Choice





needs to figure out how to make more friends. School Fiction. For grades 2-4.




<u>Lotería</u> by Karla Arenas Valenti. DB105104. In Oaxaca City, Mexico, ancient friends Life and Death discuss
