We will be accepting written comment on the proposed Oregon Administrative Rule changes by June 1, 2020 when the proposed changes are filed with the Secretary of State. We will hold a public hearing during the next regular quarterly board meeting on **Friday, July 24, 2020**. All public comments must be received by the Board by 9:00 a.m. Friday July 24, 2020.

GET YOUR ONLINE RENEWALS DONE AHEAD OF TIME!

Remember there are multiple steps in getting your online renewal completed. You will not have your renewal in hand immediately following your submission. The licensing staff has to process your application, including verification of registry status and state criminal background check.

To avoid any lapse in your active license or permit status, please renew as early as possible in the month PRIOR to your birth month.

- PRACTICING OUTSIDE YOUR SCOPE OF PRACTICE
- IGNORING YOUR DUTY TO REPORT

The OBMI is changing the way renewals, license and permit applications and all exam applications will be accepted.


Soon, we will be able to accept ALL application types on-line with a preferred payment by credit card.

ANSWER KEY TO WHAT IS THIS?

The locations of the fractures are identified by the yellow arrows.

The anatomical areas include the II and IV metacarpal bones of an Equine (a horse of course!).

Fractures of what are more commonly known as "splint bones" are caused from trauma or from working at speed.
