



C. Licensee must notify the Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine within 10 days as to how patients may access or obtain their medical records.


At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, Licensee's status will be reviewed in an expeditious manner. Following that review if the Board determines that Licensee shall not be permitted to return to the practice of medicine, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that decision.

This Order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 183.430(2) and ORS 685.110 (14) for the purpose of protecting the public and making a complete investigation to fully inform itself with respect to the performance or conduct of the Licensee and Licensee's ability to safely and competently practice medicine. Pursuant to ORS 685.115, Board investigative materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document and is reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank. This Order becomes effective the date it is signed by the Board's Executive Director in accordance with OAR 850-050-0010.
