Produce Safety Program at ODA




- Non-regulatory program funded by grant from the Food and Drug Administration
- FDA conducts Produce Safety Rule inspections in Oregon
- Partnership with Oregon State University
- 4 program staff
- Current budget: \$630,000

Education & Outreach



- Attendance at a recognized training is a requirement for covered farms
- Free, online during COVID-19

Technical Assistance



- Voluntary, free, confidential and non-regulatory
- Assess specifics of your farm with the Produce Safety Rule

Farm Inventory



- Identify farms subject to the rule
- Provided to FDA for inspection planning



Why Is ODA Not Doing Inspections?

Funding

- Unclear at the time who the monetary burden would fall to if FDA funding went away
- When states were first approached to take on funding, Cooperative Agreement with FDA was for five years (2016 2021). Currently in second five-year funding cycle (2021-2026).

Industry

Majority of industry had not been in favor of ODA taking on this role

Rule not finalized


Parts of the rule were put on hold soon after it came out and have not been finalized

If ODA Took On A Regulatory Program

- Regulatory (Path B), under FDA authority
 - Total Award: \$1,130,000 (+\$500,000)
 - Same duties as Path A
 - Inspection Program

- 5 year funding cycle (2021 2026)
 - Current Non-regulatory (Path A)
 - Total Award: \$630,000
 - Assessment & Planning, Program Administration, Farm Inventory, Outreach & Education, Technical Assistance





If ODA Took On A Regulatory Program

Conduct inspections under FDA Authority (Senate Bill 18)

- Required to inspect 165 operations / year
 - FDA requires states to inspection 20% of farms in inventory
- ODA would not conduct inspections until 2024, overlap with FDA
