Other

-  Any of the following abnormalities:
 - Any unidentified vesicular disease;
 - Any exotic or foreign animal disease, even if only suspected;
 - Any disease of unknown etiology exhibiting highly pathogenic or lethal effects;
 - Any exotic vector (flies, larvae, mites, ticks); and
 - Any disease, infection, or infestation in domestic or wild animals that poses a significant threat to terrestrial animals, aquatic animals, or humans (see OAR 603-011-0214 for details).

*This is an abridged list of avian diseases required by law to be reported by veterinarians. Oregon Administrative Rules (603-011-0214 - 603-011-0216) outline the complete lists of diseases of interest to the state and reporting requirements.
