Sorry, pets are not allowed.

Oregon law **prohibits all animals** except for service animals in grocery stores, restaurants, and other food establishments.



Service animals are trained working dogs, NOT pets.

- The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) defines a service animal as a dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability.
- Dogs or therapy animals whose function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals according to the ADA, even with a doctor's note.
- Stores are not required to allow service dogs in shopping carts.
 Service dogs should stay on the floor or be carried if needed—such as in a chest pack for medical alerts.
