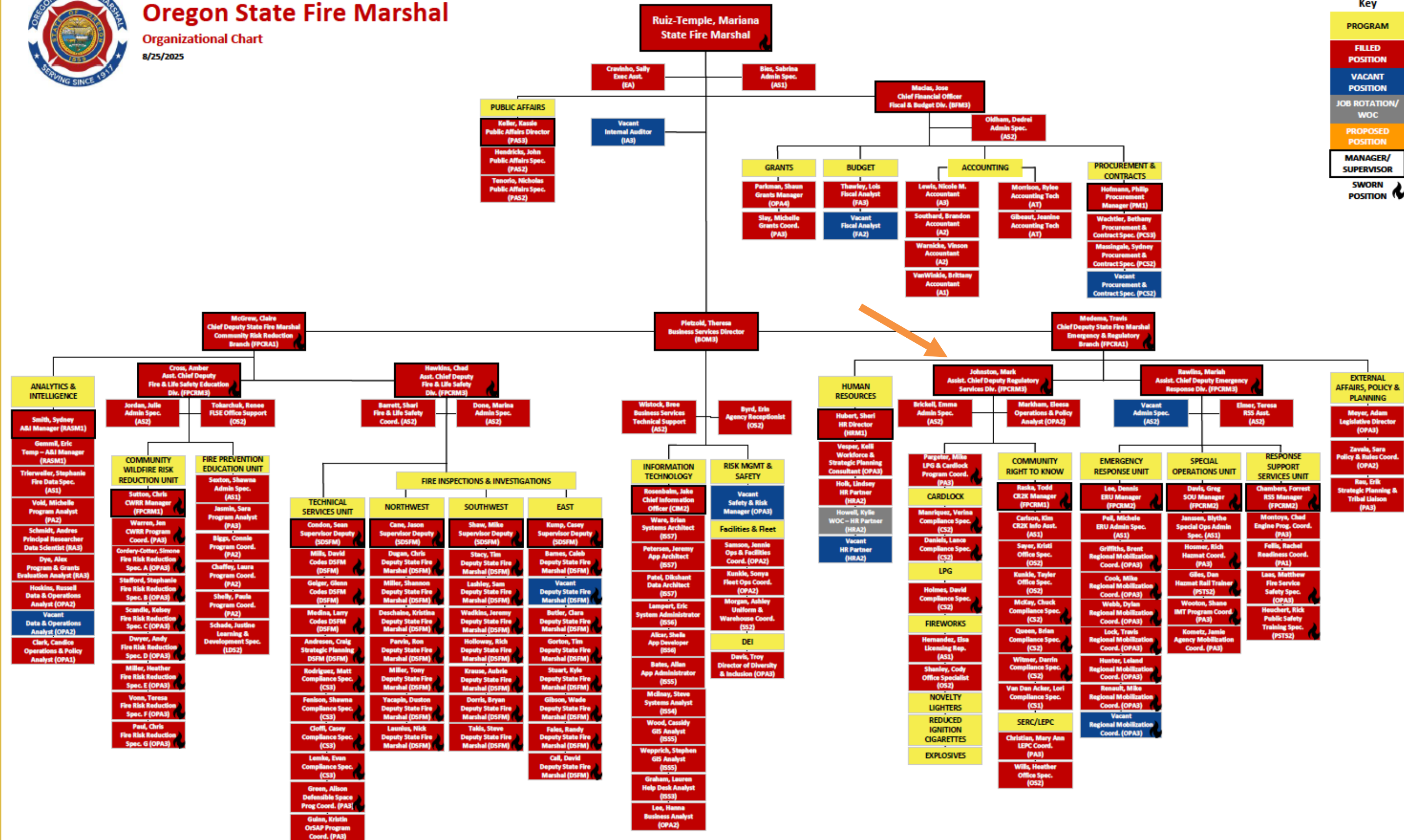

Explosives

- A federal license from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (BATFE / ATF) provides exemption from state registration requirements under Oregon law (SB 89, 2009). However, all individuals and companies must report the movement of explosives magazines to help safeguard first responders and communities.

Fire Standard Cigarettes

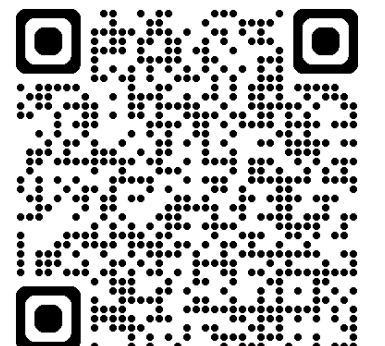
- The Oregon Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Oregon State Fire Marshal (OSFM) entered into an agreement whereby DOJ will assist the OSFM in determining whether cigarettes have reduced ignition propensity and in issuing, keeping current, and making available to the public a list of cigarette varieties with reduced ignition propensity as described in [ORS 476.770](#).
- Cigarettes must meet state requirements to be sold in Oregon.
- REDUCED IGNITION PROPENSITY CIGARETTES - **ORS 476.755 to 476.790 and 476.995**

Wholesale dealers shall provide one copy of the manufacturers' illustration to each retail dealer that receives cigarettes from them.

Manufacturers may only sell cigarettes that are fire standard compliant to wholesalers or retailers.

Retail dealers may only sell cigarettes that are fire standard compliant.

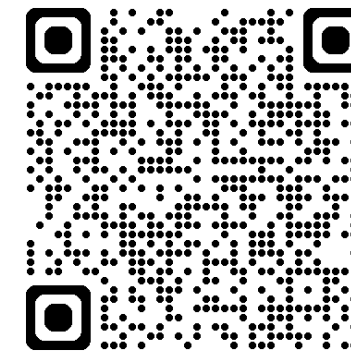

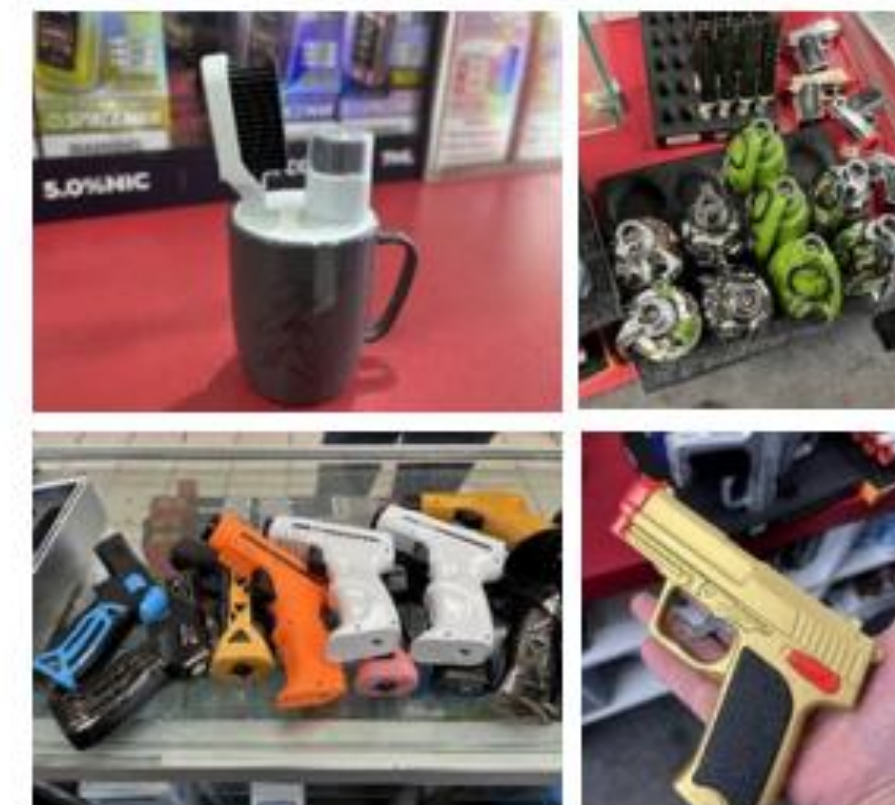
Novelty Lighters

- Novelty or toylike lighters look like toys and have audio or visual effects or a misleading design that makes them appealing to a children.
- **Oregon law prohibits the sale, manufacturing, importing, or distribution of novelty or toylike lighters.**
- Exceptions:
 - A lighter manufactured before January 1, 1980
 - A lighter that has been rendered permanently incapable of producing a flame or otherwise causing combustion
 - A lighter with only logos, decals, decorative artwork or heat-shrinkable sleeves
- **Examples of Novelty Lighter Shapes:**
 - Cartoon characters, figurines or action figures
 - Toys or game pieces
 - Musical instruments
 - Vehicles
 - Human body parts
 - Food, beverages or a combo of both
 - Weaponry
 - Furniture
 - Sports Equipment
 - Holiday decoration
 - Tools
 - Household products

CR2K & EPCRA – The History

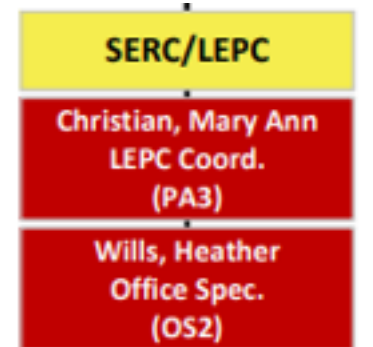
- **1984** – Bhopal, India - 27 tons of methyl isocyanate (MIC) gas released
 - Over 500,000 people were exposed
 - 3800 Dead
 - 11, 000 with disabilities
 - 40 permanent total disabilities
 - 2800 permanent partial disabilities
 - **1985 - Passed Oregon Community Right to Know Act**
 - Hazardous substance reporting (CR2K)
 - Assist emergency response planning
 - Reporting Haz Mat incidents
 - Regional Haz Mat Response Team program
 - Fee authority
 - **1986** – Passed Federal Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act (EPCRA) aka SARA Title Three
 - Hazardous Material Incident
 - Preplanning
 - Reporting
 - Responder and Public Awareness
 - SERC/LEPC requirements
 - **1985** - Institute, West Virginia - A small cloud of toxic chemicals escaped from a Union Carbide plant
 - 135 Injured, 28 admitted to hospitalized
 - **2013** - West, Texas - Fertilizer storage and distribution facility – Fire and Explosion - 30 tons fertilizer grade ammonium nitrate
 - Killed 15 people killed (9 volunteer firefighters)
 - 160 plus injured
 - 150 buildings damaged or destroyed
- Other incidents through out the decades:**
- Cuyahoga river burns, OH 1969
 - Three-mile island, PA 1979
 - Love Canal, NY 1980
 - Train derailment, Mosier OR, 2016
 - Dust explosion, Silverton OR 2021 (one fatality)



Regulatory Services Division

EPCRA - SERC/LEPC

- States required to establish a SERC
 - By statute, OSFM is the SERC
- SERC required to establish Emergency Planning Districts and Local Emergency Planning Committees
 - Oregon aligned it's planning districts by county.
 - Some multi-county LEPCs.
- LEPC is required to perform Hazmat emergency preparedness
- Unfunded mandates
- Other EPCRA sections
 - List of dangerous substance and Threshold Planning Quantity (TPQ)
 - Emergency release notifications
 - **Inventory reporting to locals**
 - Provided SDSs





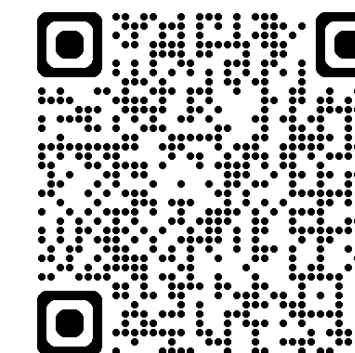
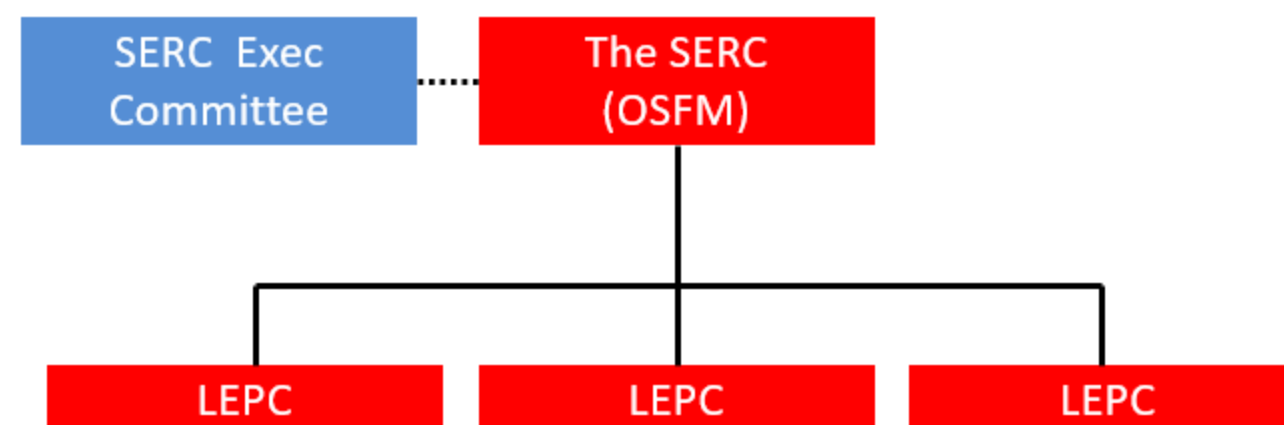

SERC Executive Committee

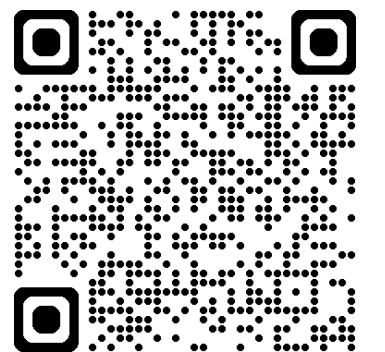
- The purpose of the SERC Executive Committee is to assist and advise the SERC for implementing EPCRA.

SERC Committee Responsibilities

- Advise the SERC on designation of planning districts.
- Advise on the creation, modification, dissolving of LEPCs.
- Review ERPs and make recommendations.
- Support LEPCs implementing EPCRA.
- Coordinate Hazmat training, education, exercises, and outreach.
- Grant and technical assistance opportunities.
- Recommending priorities for HMEP grant funds.

LEPC Responsibilities

- Oversee and coordinate the development of a county wide emergency plan using of the Nine Planning Elements
- Exercise / Evaluate the plans
- Review plans at least annually
- Hold annual public meeting
- Receive new plans from regulated industry
- Receive and make public Emergency Release Reports
- Assure that the public is aware of your activities

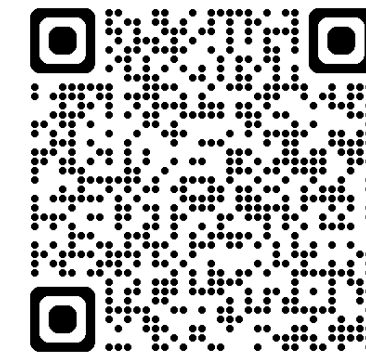
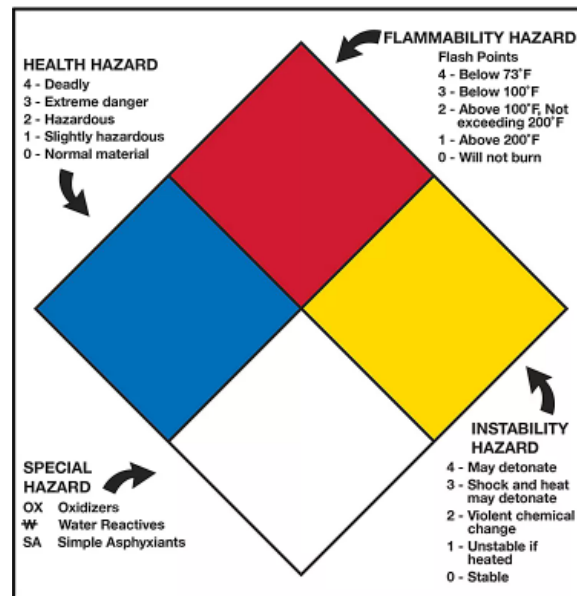
- Staff – 4 Compliance Specialist, 2 Office Staff, 1 Information Assistant, 1 Program Manager

CR2K

- Reportable Substances
 - Requires an SDS
 - 500 units for most substances
 - EPCRA TPQs
 - 5 Gallons
 - 10 Pounds
 - 20 Cubic Ft.
 - Explosives and Highly Toxics
- Radioactive - Any amount (not sealed source)

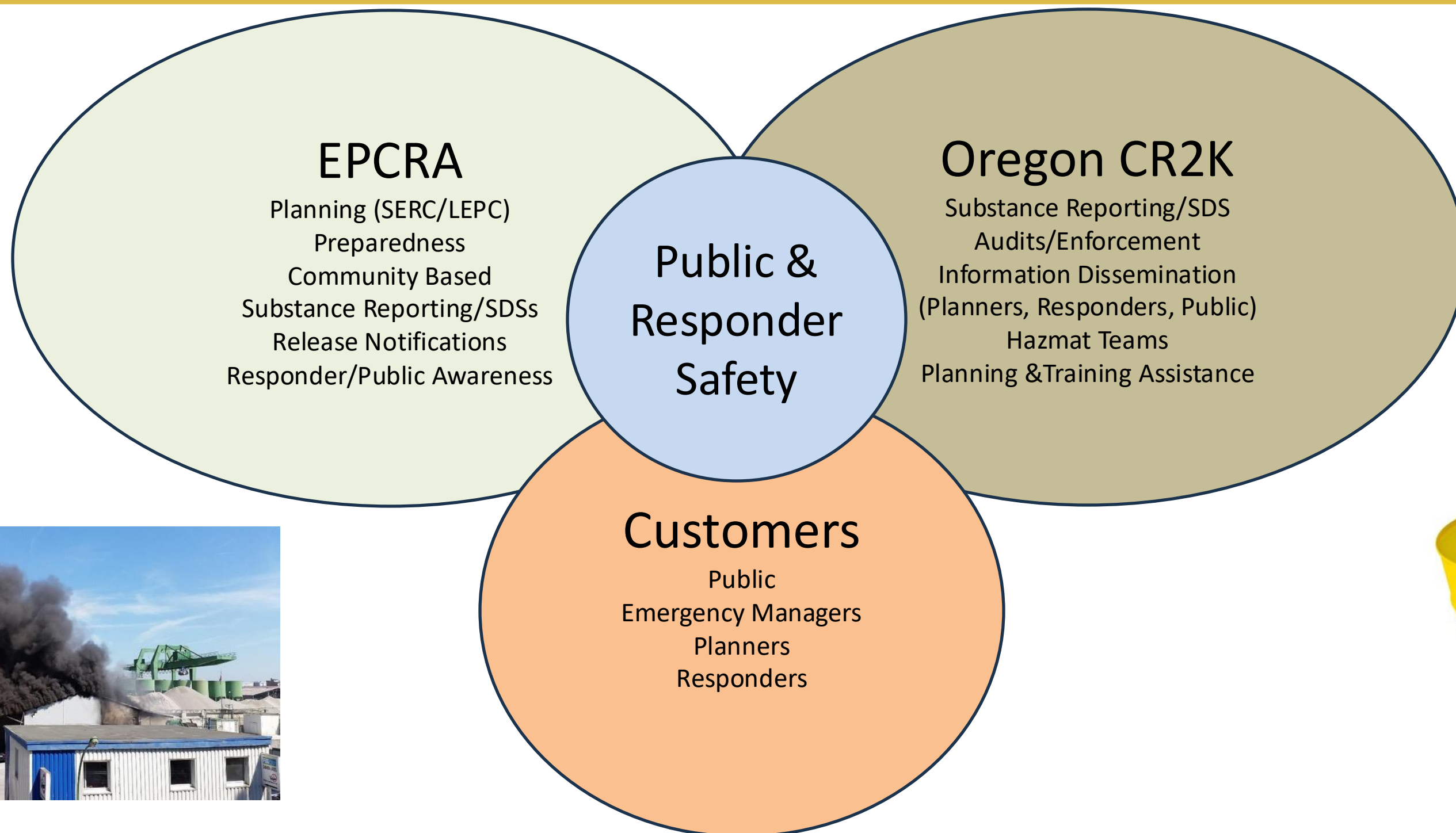

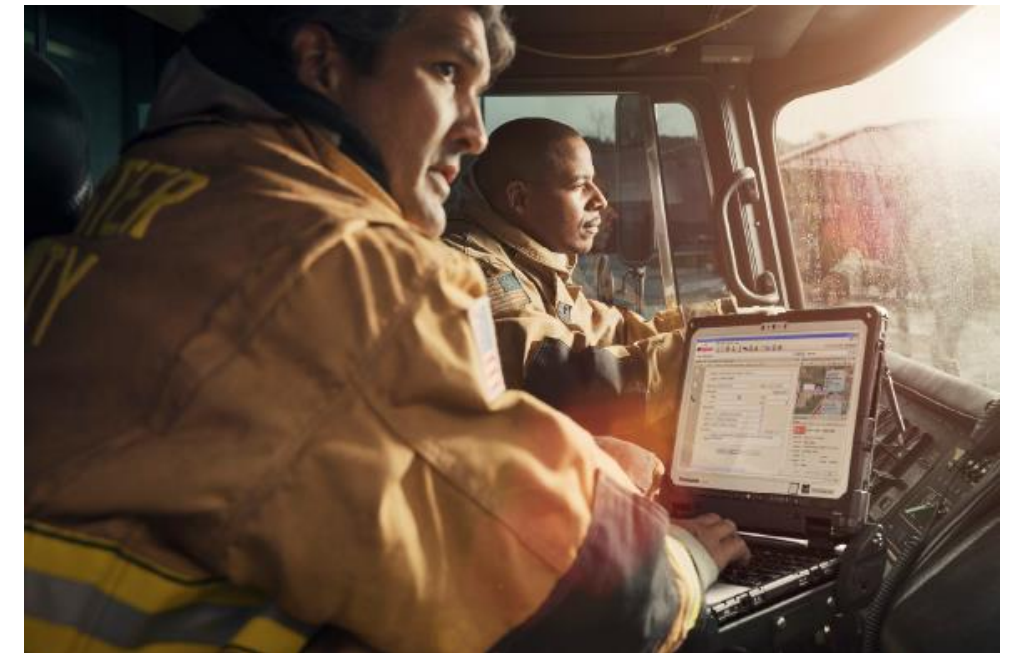
