


Q5 What types of pests that might require pesticide application are most commonly encountered in your school building envelopes (in and within 5' of the building)? Check all that apply:




Q9 What types of pesticide application equipment are used most often in your school(s)? Check all that apply:




PROPOSED SCHOOL IPM LICENSE CATEGORY

Coverage: Pesticide applications on school campus

Possibly not allow:

- Use of foggers
- Use of Restricted Use Pesticides & Unregistered Products
- Power-driven equipment (e.g. boom)
- Control of wood-destroying pests
- Control of certain public health pests:
 - Bed bugs, lice, fleas, ticks, and adult mosquitoes





PROPOSED REVISION TO SCHOOL DEFINITION

OAR 603-057-0500(14) "School" means

- (a) A facility operating an Oregon prekindergarten or a federal Head Start program;
- (b) A public or private educational institution offering education in all or part of kindergarten through grade 12;
- (c) The Oregon School for the Deaf; and
- (d) A regional academy operated by the Oregon Youth Authority.

ORS 634.700(8) "School" means:

- (a) A facility operating an Oregon prekindergarten or a federal Head Start program;
- (b) A public or private educational institution offering education in all or part of kindergarten through grade 12;
- (c) An education service district as defined in ORS 334.003;**
- (d) A community college as defined in ORS 341.005, for the community college's own buildings and ground maintenance;**
- (e) The Oregon School for the Deaf; and
- (f) A regional **residential** academy operated by the Oregon Youth Authority.



PROPOSED REVISION TO SCHOOL DEFINITION

OAR 603-057-0500(14)
"School" has the meaning
defined in ORS 634.700.

ORS 634.700(8) "School" means:

- (a) A facility operating an Oregon prekindergarten or a federal Head Start program;
- (b) A public or private educational institution offering education in all or part of kindergarten through grade 12;
- (c) An education service district as defined in ORS 334.003;**
- (d) A community college as defined in ORS 341.005, for the community college's own buildings and ground maintenance;**
- (e) The Oregon School for the Deaf; and
- (f) A regional **residential** academy operated by the Oregon Youth Authority.

- Jan. 11th 2019, 5pm: Public Comment Period Closed
- File final rules Jan. 17-18th
- Feb./March: Manual becomes available through OSU PSEP
- March/April: Exam becomes available
