

STUDENT SUCCESS ACT

2025-2027 PROGRAM FUNDING

Student Success Act (SSA) investments represented by account: *Student Investment Account, Statewide Education Initiatives Account & Early Learning Account*. Together, all three accounts make up the “Fund for Student Success.” In addition to these three accounts, the Fund for Student Success allocates moneys for reserve funds, state administration, High-Cost Disability Fund, and State School Fund.

Student Investment Account (SIA)

Non-competitive grant; funding distributed by per-student formula to improve student outcomes and well-being

Who is eligible? School districts, eligible charter schools, YCEP/JDEP & LTCTs

Early Literacy Success School District Grants

Non-competitive grants to increase early literacy for PK-3 students. Funding distributed by per student formula.

Who is eligible? School districts and (non-virtual) public charter schools serving students in grades PK-3

\$2.08 million

Early Literacy Success Tribal Grants

Non-competitive grants to the nine federally recognized Tribes in Oregon to support Tribe-directed early literacy projects that work to address disparities in literacy outcomes.

Who is eligible? Tribal governments

\$8.34 million

Early Literacy Success Community Grants

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, Early Learning Hubs, providers of early learning services, Tribes, public libraries, post-secondary institutions of education

\$27.18 million

Intensive Program/Student Success Teams

Focused supports to districts to advance **Student Investment Account** implementation.

Who is eligible? Identified school districts with the highest needs

\$44.61 million

SIA District Support

Non-competitive grants; technical assistance for **Student Investment Account** implementation.

Who is eligible? Education Service Districts (ESDs)

\$2.14 million

Public Charter Schools Equity Grants

Non-competitive grants; funding distributed by per student formula.

Who is eligible? Public charter schools with at least 65% students from identified groups with historic academic disparities

High School Success

Non-competitive grants to increase graduation rates and ensure readiness for college and career.

Who is eligible? School districts, public charter schools, YCEP/JDEP, LTCT, and Oregon School for the Deaf serving students in grades 9-12

\$128.6 million

Expanded Access to School Meals (including Breakfast After the Bell) Reimbursement funding; based on number of school meals served; Non-competitive breakfast equipment grants.

Who is eligible? School districts and public charter schools

\$3.96 million

Early Indicator and Intervention System (EIS)

Non-competitive grants to support systems that track student progress toward graduation; funding distributed by per student formula.

Who is eligible? School districts, public charter schools, YCEP/JDEP, and LTCT

\$1.98 million

EIS Technical Assistance

Contracts to provide technical assistance to schools on best practices for EIS system.

Who is eligible? Organizations with EIS expertise

\$1.57 million for a total of \$29.39 m

JDEP/YCEP Targeted Funding Level

Distribution based on level of funding.

Who is eligible? JDEP/YCEP programs

\$3.23 million

Statewide School Safety & Prevention System

Contracts to provide regional School Safety and Prevention Specialist to provide support and training for districts, schools and community partners.

Who is eligible? ESDs and other eligible providers

\$5.79 million for a total funding of \$6.93 m

Recovery Schools

Competitive grant; Awards cover costs of enrolled students (in addition to the SSF allocation).

Who is eligible? ESDs, school districts and public charter schools. Up to 3 approved recovery high schools

\$2.76 million for total funding of \$5.59 m

American Indian/Alaska Native Student Success Plan

Grants and contracts; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Tribal governments, school districts, early learning hubs, providers of early learning services, ESDs, CBOs, and Higher Education

\$6.66 million

African American/Black Student Success Plan

Competitive grant; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, school districts, public charter schools, ESDs, Early Learning Hubs, providers of early learning services, and post-secondary institutions

\$2.14 million

LGBTQ2SIA+ Student Success Plan

Competitive grant; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, school districts, public charter schools, ESDs, Early Learning Hubs, providers of early learning services, post-secondary institutions and Tribal governments

Latino, Latina, Latinx & Indigenous Student Success Plan

Competitive grant; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, school districts, public charter schools, ESDs, Early Learning Hubs, providers of early learning services, post-secondary institutions and Tribal governments

\$1.03 million

Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander Student Success Plan

Competitive grant; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, school districts, public charter schools, ESDs, Early Learning Hubs, providers of early learning services, post-secondary institutions and Tribal governments

\$2.01 million

Immigrant/Refugee Student Success Plan

Competitive grant; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, school districts, public charter schools, ESDs, Early Learning Hubs, providers of early learning services, post-secondary institutions and Tribal governments

\$9.06 million

Youth Reengagement

Competitive grant to reconnect youth to educational pathways; Awards based on criteria established in rule

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, school districts, public charter schools, alternative schools, ESDs, Tribal governments, local governments, workforce boards, and community colleges

\$4.85 million

ESD Support to Small and Rural School Districts

Non-competitive grants to provide technical assistance and reduce administrative burden for rural and small school districts

Who is eligible? ESDs

\$3.74 million

Educator Professional Development

Educator Equity Programs & Professional Learning Grants.

Who is eligible? Educator candidates, Tribal governments, ESDs, school districts

EARLY LEARNING ACCOUNT

\$25.39 million for total funding of \$27.16 m

Early Childhood Equity Fund

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Culturally specific programs and organizations

\$18.32 million

Early Learning Program Supports

IGAs/contracts for support services for Preschool Promise such as enrollment, eligibility, coaching, TA, assessments, inclusionary supports.

Who is eligible? Organizations with expertise in early learning supports

\$226.26 million for total funding of \$370.56 m

Oregon Prenatal to Kindergarten

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Federal Head Start and current Oregon Pre-K Grantees

\$137.47 million for total funding of \$179.01 m

Preschool Promise

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Tribal governments, Family Child Care, Child Care Centers, Head Start and OPK, other community based organizations, school districts, ESDs

\$8.51 million for a total of \$28.26 m

Relief Nurseries

Funding distributed by Department of Early Learning and Care.

Who is eligible? Certified Relief Nursery sites

\$6.45 million for total funding of \$42.83 m

Healthy Families Oregon (HFO)

Funding distributed to Healthy Families Oregon grantees

Who is eligible? Healthy Families Oregon grantees

\$4.34 million

Parenting Education

Funding distributed through Oregon Parenting Education Collaborative.

Who is eligible? Parenting focused organizations

\$27.14 million

Professional Learning and Workforce

Funding to provide professional development, coaching & technical assistance to child care providers.

Who is eligible? Organizations with expertise on high-quality, early learning practices

\$122.64 million for total funding of \$415.9 m

Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education

Funding distributed by ODE to service providers.

Who is eligible? EI/ECSE Grantees (8 ESDs & 1SD)

\$10.01 million

Early Literacy - Birth through Five Grants

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Current ECEF grantees or similar organizations

\$3.96 million for total funding of \$23.89 m

Early Learning Hubs

Funding to support regional early childhood services.

Who is eligible? Early Learning Hubs
