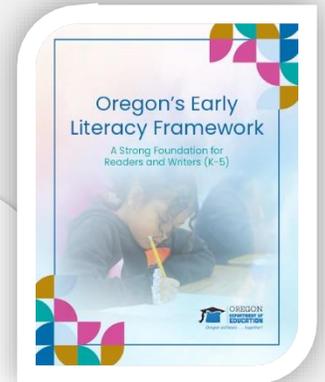
Alignment to Oregon's Early Literacy Framework

Nextcelerate's high-impact tutoring program aligns with Oregon's Early Literacy Framework by:

Pre-service training includes "Identity, culture and equity in tutoring" and "Support language and literacy for multilingual students," which are nano courses that foster culturally responsive practices crucial for diverse learners. The program uses academic data and assessments for student selection and progress tracking, aligning with Framework's emphasis on identifying needs and monitoring growth.

Nextcelerate significantly contributes to educator capacity building through extensive pre-service and ongoing training, coaching, and a micro-credential program. This directly supports the goal of enhancing literacy instruction and professional development for educators.



Evidence of Impact

Lessons Learned: Tutoring in Henrico County

The experience over the past two years tutoring middle school math in Henrico County, Virginia has helped gather valuable insights into what makes a successful learning environment for students and how to better meet their unique needs.

Student Motivation and Engagement: One key takeaway is that students genuinely want to succeed, but their belief in the possibility of success plays a significant role. If they feel like they can succeed and that they are in a space designed for their growth, their motivation skyrockets. Students also have different views of tutoring. If tutoring is perceived as a punishment, students tend to disengage. On the other hand, when they feel tutoring is a benefit they've earned—something that will help them achieve their goals—they are much more cooperative and proactive. This requires careful communication and tutor training to ensure students understand the value of tutoring and how it can help them succeed.
