

IMSE integrates regular assessments and progress monitoring, including diagnostic tools and embedded checks for learning to inform instruction and grouping decisions. Family engagement is supported through accessible parent resources, multilingual communication, and home-school literacy activities. Finally, IMSE builds educator capacity through accredited, tiered professional development, coaching, and practicum experiences tailored for classroom teachers, specialists, administrators, and paraprofessionals. This wraparound model ensures educators are equipped to implement effective literacy instruction aligned with Oregon's guiding principles of equity, belonging, and high expectations.



## Evidence of Impact

IMSE OG+ has been rigorously evaluated and acknowledged for meeting the educational impact criteria of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), warranting a Level 2 for "Moderate" Evidence. This recognition is based on its proven effectiveness in enhancing grade-level learning outcomes. The Kent State study found that students taught by IMSE OG-trained teachers had significantly higher spring ORF scores compared to the control group, controlling for fall baseline scores. The impact was observed across all three grade levels, demonstrating consistent gains in reading fluency.
