

Each course spans a full semester (15 weeks), allowing candidates ample time to acquire, practice, implement, receive feedback on, reflect upon, and refine their learning. Course assignments are directly connected to student learning and assessment, with candidates conducting one-on-one literacy assessments and delivering literacy lessons, followed by reflective analysis of their instructional practice.

Alignment to Oregon's Early Literacy Framework



Professional learning at Pacific University teaches best practices of multi-sensory, explicit instruction for writing, phonological awareness and vocabulary. Pacific University's Dyslexia Certificate program supports Early Literacy teaching and learning through 15 semester credits. The courses are offered over 3 semesters, allowing participants to develop and expand their skills and knowledge throughout their work. The program can be accessed by individual teachers, or to a school or district cohort.
