2021-2023 PROGRAM FUNDING

Student Success Act (SSA) investments represented by account: *Student Investment Account, Statewide Education Initiatives Account & Early Learning Account*. Together, all three accounts make up the “Fund for Student Success.” In addition to these three accounts, the Fund for Student Success allocates monies for reserve funds, state administration, High-Cost Disability Fund, and State School Fund.

Non-competitive grant; funding distributed by per student formula.

Who is eligible? School districts, eligible charter schools, YCEP/JDEP

\$25 million

Intensive Program/Student Success Teams

Focused supports to districts to advance **Student Investment Account** priorities and activities; funding based on per student formula.

Who is eligible? Identified school districts with the highest needs

\$41.1 million

SIA District Support - Education Service Districts

Non-competitive grant; technical assistance for **Student Investment Account** implementation.

Who is eligible? ESDs

\$2 million

Public Charter Schools Equity Grants

Non-competitive grant; distributed by per student formula. **Who is eligible?** Public charter schools with at least 65% students from identified groups with historic academic disparities

\$136.7 million for total funding of \$307.3 m

High School Success

Non-competitive grant; distributed by per high school student formula.

Who is eligible? School districts, charter schools, YCEP/JDEP and Oregon School for the Deaf

\$53.4 million

Expanded Access to School Meals

Reimbursement funding; based on number of school meals served; Non-competitive breakfast equipment grants.

Who is eligible? School districts, charter schools, and other eligible providers

\$3.7 million

Early Indicator and Intervention System (EIIS) Non-competitive grant; Allocated to support systems that track student progress toward graduation; distributed by per student formula.

Who is eligible? School districts and charter schools

\$1.8 million

EIIS Technical Assistance

Contracts to provide technical assistance to schools on best practices for EIIS system.

Who is eligible? Organizations with expertise on EIIS systems

\$3.3 million

Statewide School Safety & Prevention System

Non-competitive grants, agreements or contracts to provide coordinated & regionalized school safety services.

Who is eligible? ESDs and other eligible providers

\$30.7 million

Educator Workforce Development & Diversity

Competitive grants; Other supports for diversifying educator profession; noncompetitive grants

Who is eligible? For grants: School Districts, ESDs, Early Learning, Post-secondary, Tribal governments, and non-profit organizations

\$7.7 million for total funding of \$19.1m

African American Black Student Success Plan

Competitive grant; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, Culturally Specific Organizations, School Districts, ESDs, Early Learning, and Post-secondary

\$6.7 million

American Indian/Alaska Native Student Success Plan

Grants and contracts; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Tribal governments, Community-Based Organizations, Culturally Specific Organizations, School Districts, ESDs, Early Learning, and Post-secondary

\$2 million

LGBTQ2SIA+ Student Success Plan Competitive grants; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule. **Who is eligible?** Community-Based Organizations, Culturally Specific Organizations, School Districts, ESDs, Charter Schools, Early Learning, Post-secondary, and Tribal governments

\$6.1 million

Latino, Latina, Latinx & Indigenous Student Success Plan Competitive grant; Awards based on statewide plan and criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Community-Based Organizations, Culturally Specific Organizations, School Districts, ESDs, Early Learning, Post-secondary, and Tribal governments

Youth Reengagement Program Competitive grants; Award based on criteria established in rule

Who is eligible? School districts, charter schools, ESDs, Tribal governments, Local Governments, Alternative Schools, Community Colleges, and Community organizations

\$8.3 million

Summer Program Grants/Title I Schools

Non-competitive grant for identified Title I schools; distributed by per student formula.

Who is eligible? Identified school districts and charter schools

EARLY LEARNING ACCOUNT

\$23.9 million

Early Childhood Equity Fund

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Culturally specific programs and organizations

\$52.4 million for total funding of \$54.2 m

Early Head Start

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Care Centers, Head Start, and other Community Organizations

\$110 million for total funding of \$273.2 m

Oregon Pre-K

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Head Start & Oregon Pre-K Grantees

\$108.6 million for total funding of \$146.8 m

Preschool Promise

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Schools, Family Child Care, Child Care Centers, Head Start, and other Community Organizations

\$7.8 million for a total of \$21.7m

Relief Nurseries

Funding distributed by Early Learning Division.

Who is eligible? Certified Relief Nursery sites

\$5 million for total funding of \$39m

Healthy Families Oregon

Competitive grant; Awards based on criteria established in rule.

Who is eligible? Healthy Families Oregon sites

\$4.1 million

Parenting Education

Funding distributed in partnership with Oregon Parenting Education Collaborative.

Who is eligible? Parenting focused organizations

\$83.8 million for total funding of \$328.9 m

Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education

Funding distributed by ODE to service providers.

Who is eligible? EI/ECSE Contractors (mostly ESDs)

\$25 million

Coaching and Professional Learning

Agreements to provide professional development, coaching & technical assistance to child care providers.

Who is eligible? Organizations with expertise on high-quality, early learning practices
