CROWN ACT HAS PASSED IN OREGON!

The CROWN Act makes it illegal to discriminate against people who are wearing braids, locs, twists, knots, or protective hairstyles (including a head/hair wrap in the workplace and public schools, community colleges, and universities).



What steps do I take if I think my child's rights were violated at school?

- 1. Write down what happened and as many details as you and your child can recall.
- 2. File a complaint at your school.
- 3. If the complaint is not resolved to your satisfaction, you can file a complaint with the Oregon Department of Education (ODE). ODE requires you to exhaust local processes prior to their involvement.
- 4. Finally, you may consider filing a complaint with the US Department of Education Office for Civil Rights.
