


Improve children's readiness for kindergarten

#### HB 3380: Mixed Delivery Preschool

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□ There are over **230,000** children **under the age of 5**.

- Less than 15,000 of these children are in publicly funded preschool programs (Oregon Prekindergarten and Early Head Start).
- 72% of children from families experiencing poverty (below 200% of the federal poverty level) do not have access to public preschool.

#### HB 3380: Mixed Delivery Preschool

- Groundwork for serving all eligible children in high quality publicly funded preschool
- Expands eligibility from 100% to 200% of the federal poverty level
- □ Coordination with Early Learning Hubs
- Collaboration across preschool settings

  - Child Care
  - Community Based Organizations
  - Elementary Schools
