
The Military Interstate Compact

- History
 - Title 10 active Duty families move every 2-4 years
 - Military dependents enter and exit different school districts, confronting different standards
- Senate Bill 1506 signed in 2014
 - Oregon becomes the 47th Compact member
 - The Oregon Council for Educational Opportunity for Military Children convened in 2016


