Building Educator Assessment Literacy (BEAL)

Oregon Department of Education invites you to participate in the *Building Educator Assessment Literacy* (*BEAL*), **a free performance assessment professional development event.** BEAL events will be conducted by teams of Oregon educators who were trained by WestEd and Understanding Language-Stanford Center for Assessment, Learning and Equity.

Participants will work in one of the following four break-out groups:

- Math elementary*
- Math secondary
- ELA/Literacy elementary*
- ELA/Literacy secondary

*Elementary educators are asked to register for either math or ELA/Literacy

Within these breakout groups, participants will collaborate with colleagues on:

- collaboratively scoring student work from Smarter Balanced performance tasks to build a common understanding of what student proficiency looks like;
- reviewing student work as the basis for reflecting on the evidence of learning that performance tasks can generate; and
- planning ways of using performance tasks as part of formative assessment practice, including providing feedback and planning instructional practices.

2016-17 Test Administration Manual Updated

Following the launch of ODE's new website on December 20, 2016, the 2016-17 <u>Test Administration</u> <u>Manual</u> has been updated to include corrected URLs. ELPA21 2015-16 Individual Student Reports

Individual Student Reports (ISRs) for the ELPA21 were provided to DTCs between November 30 and December 8 via secure file transfer. Since these ISRs were distributed, many have requested a version with the SSID suppressed. Additionally, the score reporting category on pages 5 and 7 was incorrect on the bilingual versions. Instead of introducing category 3 and category 4, the information for category 2 was repeated on these pages. ISRs have been updated to suppress student SSIDs as well as correct the error on the score reporting category on the Spanish versions for all grades except Kindergarten, which did not contain this error.

The updated ISRs were developed in both English-only and bilingual Spanish-English. Each of these files contain secure information and need to be provided to appropriate staff in a secure manner as outlined in section 2.5 Student Confidentiality of the <u>Test Administration Manual</u>. The ISR PDFs are labeled with the school district ID, school ID, student grade, and student name.

ELPA21 Score Reporting Information Now Available

ODE has posted a new video that introduces users to information about ELPA21 score reports. EXTENDED ASSESSMENT

Collection of Additional Data Points

Beginning with this administration of Oregon's Extended Assessment, ODE plans to collect the primary and secondary (if applicable) eligibility codes as well as accommodation codes (maximum of six) to enhance our efforts in identifying who is participating in the Oregon Extended Assessment as well as to review the kinds of accommodation supports being utilized for each student and in relation to the various eligibility categories. For this school year (2016-17), providing this data is voluntary--with a plan to require Qualified Assessors to provide this data next school year (2017-18).

2016-2017 Kindergarten Assessment Report Validation Window

The 2016-2017 preliminary Oregon Kindergarten Assessment results are available for districts to review in the Kindergarten Assessment Validation located in the <u>Achievement Data Insight</u> (ADI) Application from **January 5 through January 20, 2017.** ODE will refresh the preliminary data on an as needed basis. Statewide data will be released to the public on **Thursday, February 9, 2017**.

Please contact your <u>Regional ESD Partner</u> for collections if you find any discrepancies in your Kindergarten Assessment Validation data. If corrections are needed, please send collection open requests to your <u>Regional ESD Partner</u> and CC Amber Helvie (<u>amber.helvie@state.or.us</u>). The last day to make changes in the Kindergarten Assessment Collections is **Friday, January 27, 2017**. Final Cohort Graduation and NCES Dropout Rates Available

The final versions of the 2015-16 graduation and dropout rates are available for you to preview in the Achievement Data Insight application, as of 1 pm on January 5. You will find the relevant tiles under the "All" tab, as the validations are no longer open. No additional changes to the data can be made at this time; however, if you submitted an appeal by the December 9 deadline and it was approved, please let us know immediately if it is not reflected in the final rates.

Please note that these results are **embargoed until the public release**, **on January 26**. Please **do not share them** with anyone other than authorized district personnel before this time. If you have questions, please contact <u>Isabella Jacoby</u> or your <u>Regional ESD partners</u>.

2016-17 Test Records Available and Webinar Training

OAKS Online test records for Science and Social Sciences are available in the Student Centered Staging, Accountability Warehouse Extract (AWE), and Secure Assessment Reports 2.0 (SAR) applications beginning **January 12, 2017**. OAKS Science and Social Sciences records will *typically* be available in Student Centered Staging two days after the student completes a test. **Please note** that there is a one-day lag for changes to test records in Student Centered Staging (district edits or newly loaded records) to be available in the AWE and SAR applications.

There will be a Video Training webinar on **Thursday, January 12 at 2 PM**. This webinar will focus on management of assessment data in Student Centered Staging (i.e., editing posted records; reviewing and correcting errors; applying administration codes) and accessing the test records in the AWE and SAR applications. Question & Answer Answers to Common Questions from the Field

Question: Can staff funded solely out of Title I-A administer Oregon's statewide assessments?

Answer: The answer is no, these staff may not administer statewide assessments because it is considered supplanting. Supplanting occurs if the LEA uses federal funds to provide services that the LEA is required to make available under other federal, state, or local laws. Since administering state assessments is required under state law, a teacher solely paid out of Title I-A funds could not administer these tests. State assessments need to occur during a student's core academic instructional time, not during their supplemental/intervention time. An allowable strategy that districts may follow to enable staff who are otherwise funded by Title I-A to administer state tests would be to pay for the portion of the teacher's salary dedicated to testing out of general funds rather than Title I-A funds.

This restriction applies to all of Oregon's statewide assessments: The Smarter Balanced math and ELA assessments, OAKS Online science and social sciences, the Grade 12 OAKS retests in math, reading, and writing, the ELPA, the Extended Assessments, and the Kindergarten Assessment.
