OSAS Professional Development Opportunity: ELA and Mathematics Summative Test Scoring REPEAT

The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) is seeking educators interested in participating in the scoring of ELA and Mathematics test items for Oregon Statewide Summative Tests.

 This training is primarily intended for individuals who would like to deepen their understanding of hand-scored items and the rubrics used to score them.

The initial training for this project will occur on March 17, 2023, in Salem, OR. Substitute and travel costs for the March 17 training day will be covered by ODE.

 As a reminder, recruited applicants will be signed on as temporary employees with ODE and Measurement Incorporated and will receive compensation at the standard ODE rate of \$28.96 per hour. Following that training day, qualified raters will then remotely score items during their own off-contract time throughout spring.

The deadline for submitting an <u>application</u> is **Thursday, February 9, 2023** and ODE will notify successful applicants by **February 13**, along with information on next steps.

REMINDER: Last Day to Make Changes to First Period Cumulative Average Daily Membership (ADM) is Friday, January 20, 2023

The last day to make changes that affect the 2022-23 First Period Cumulative ADM collection is **Friday**, **January 20**, **2023**. After this date, the collection may only be reopened with Data Governance Committee formal approval on a case by case basis. Second Period Cumulative ADM 2022-23 is currently open for all districts to review first round audits, which compare to First Period Cumulative ADM.

Please ensure a member of your district has reviewed your Second Period audits and made any changes necessary to First Period by the end of this week.

Assessment Webinar Training February 23, 2023

The video training webinar that was previously scheduled for this Thursday, January 19 has been rescheduled to **Thursday**, **February 23 at 2 PM** on the <u>ODE District Training</u> page. This webinar will focus on management of assessment data in the Assessment Record Updating Application (ARUA) (i.e., editing posted records; reviewing and correcting errors; applying administration codes) and accessing the test records in the Accountability Warehouse Extract (AWE) and the Secure Assessment Reports 2.0 (SAR) applications. If you do not have access to the ARUA, AWE, or SAR applications, please contact your district security administrator.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Answers to Common Questions from the Field

QUESTION: What are the attendance reporting requirements for Cumulative ADM in 2022-23 for **Remote Instruction**?

ANSWER: For remote instructional models, schools and districts must take daily attendance. Attendance should be demonstrated in a set 24 hour window that the school establishes and communicates to families prior to the school year. The 24 hour window is not required to be from 12:00 a.m. to 11:59 p.m.

QUESTION: Our school is partnering with local businesses, and we are placing high school students in jobs where they are paid for their time worked. Students receive high school credit for the work experience and turn in a timesheet for hours worked. Can I claim the hours worked as instructional time in Cumulative ADM when the student is paid?

ANSWER: No, as noted on page 113 of the <u>Cumulative ADM manual</u>, if a student is receiving compensation for their work, they are no longer a student, but considered an employee doing work for said business.
