Updated Essential Skills and Local Performance Assessment Manual

The 2017-18 Essential Skills and Local Performance Assessment Manual has been updated to reflect changes and additional guidance in the following areas:

- Improved clarity on requirements.
- Updated OAR numbers.
- Updated Local Performance Assessment Requirement section.
- Corrected Essential Skills definition table to include ninth Essential Skill.
- Added footnote about WorkKeys version 1.0 and version 2.0.
- Added Annotated PSAT and SAT score reports as appendices.
- Added process for requesting new Standardized Assessments.
- Added guidance on scoring Reading Work Samples.
- Added information about forthcoming Local Assessment Option guidance.
- Increased clarity about Accessibility Supports for English Learners.
- Added new Designated Support: Human Scribe.
- Expanded access to Secure Work Samples: now available to students at any grade without a limit on the number per student.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Answers to Common Questions from the Field

QUESTION: For the Staff Position Collection, we contract staff for an online program. Do we report those teachers?

ANSWER: If your school/district is running/administering the program, then yes. If your school/district is simply tuitioning students to a private program that your school/district does not run, then you do not have to report those teachers.

QUESTION: My district is looking at the Local Assessment Option for Essential Skills. What should I know?

ANSWER: As this is a local option, our support is in the area of process and guidance. Over this year we will be working on building more resources to help people understand this option. Two important parts to remember about this requirement are that the district needs to be involved in the development of the assessment, and the assessment must meet established professional and technical standards. "Established professional and technical standards" refers to the Standards for Educational and Psychological Testing developed by AERA, NCME, and APA. These are rigorous standards that require a substantial scope of professional expertise to meet. ODE will be working on providing resources about considering these standards in this context. The relevant section of the OAR is included below, so you can see where these terms came from.

- OAR 581-22-2115: Assessment of Essential Skills
- (15) Districts may **develop** and administer a local assessment option for students to demonstrate proficiency in the Essential Skills, using **established professional and technical standards**

As districts consider this option, we encourage them to think through the scope of responsibility associated with defensible, high-stakes evaluation practices.

QUESTION: Since the ELA Assessment is going to be shorter this year, does that mean the kids will only need to read one article for the ELA Performance Task?

ANSWER: No, the ELA Performance Task will still have multiple sources in all grade levels. These sources will be utilized in Segment 1, as well as during the writing extended response, "full write," in Segment 2. Teachers can access practice tests in <u>OAKS Portal</u> to view samples.

QUESTION: Will the ELA CAT Assessment still contain short answer written responses?

ANSWER: The ELA CAT Assessment will not contain short answer written response items. Please refer to Oregon's <u>ELA Test Specifications and Blueprints</u> located on the ODE website for more information about the number of items and depth of knowledge for each assessment target.
