Oregon Statewide Science Assessment (OSAS) Science Phenomenon and Item Development Recruitment

The Oregon Department of Education is recruiting qualified educators to develop phenomena statements for OSAS Science Assessment item development. We will be holding a 3-day workshop in Salem, Oregon on April 2-4, 2019 to provide a deep dive into NGSS-aligned science item development. After receiving training on the process, participants will work in small groups to identify appropriate scientific phenomenon, which will become the basis for new cluster-type items aligned to specified performance expectations for the Oregon Science Assessment. Participants will conduct research to find primary scientific sources related to the topic, and will begin to build item interactions supported by the real-world data. Knowledge of Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) is beneficial but not required.
