# New Teacher Center (NTC) and Smarter Balanced Professional Learning Series

The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) is excited to announce a professional learning series developed in partnership by the New Teacher Center (NTC) and Smarter Balanced. This collaborative initiative is designed to help district teams create a system of interim and formative assessment practices customized to their local needs. Smarter Balanced resources, including Tools for Teachers and the Interim Assessment Blocks within the Oregon Statewide Assessment System (OSAS), will be utilized as connections are made between instruction and assessment.

Each team will consist of two teacher cohorts from grades 3-8 (one ELA and one Math) and work directly with NTC throughout the 2024-25 school year. ## **On-Demand Course: Effectively Using OSAS Results**

As the OSAS summative test window fully opens this spring, ODE has partnered with Southern Oregon ESD to create an on-demand asynchronous professional learning course to help district leaders, school administrators, and teachers use their OSAS results effectively. The course, <a href="Effectively Using OSAS Results">Effectively Using OSAS Results</a>, consists of five one-hour modules delivered through Canvas. Participants will gain a greater understanding of the following key concepts:

- Understanding OSAS test design is key to understanding how to use OSAS test results.
- Student performance across assessment targets, not overall proficiency rates, provides the most helpful data for use in continuous improvement.
- Trends in target results can inform curriculum planning, instructional pacing, and professional learning.
- Connections can be made between assessment targets and standards that can help educators implement powerful formative assessment practices in the classroom.

#### Future K ELPA Screener and Remote ELPA Testing Window REPEAT

The test window for the 2024-25 Future K English Language Proficiency Assessment (ELPA) Screener opens 3/1/24 and extends through the remainder of the 2024 calendar year. As a reminder, this test should be administered to students for whom a Language Use Survey has indicated the ELPA Screener needs to be administered, and who will enter Kindergarten in the 2024-25 school year. Students who need screening and are enrolling in kindergarten in the final months of the 2023-24 school year test using the Grade K form instead.

The remote ELPA Summative test window opens 3/5/24 and closes 4/12/25. Participation in the remote ELPA Summative is appropriate for schools offering primarily remote instruction. # **ACCOUNTABILITY & REPORTING**

#### **ELPA Summative Batch 1 Scores**

English Language Proficiency Assessment (ELPA) scores from January 2024 (Batch 1) are available in the Assessment Record Updating Application (ARUA) on the ODE <u>secure district website</u> and also in the Centralized Reporting System (CRS) on the OSAS Portal as of Monday, March 11.

Test scores for students participating in <u>Honoring Student Proficiency on the HS ELPA Summative</u> will be available on **Monday, March 18**. As a reminder, this means that a high school student's Proficient performance on one or more domains from a prior year will be inserted into this year's test, and the scores for all four domains will be recalculated using that Proficient performance. **Please note** that scores appearing in the Centralized Reporting System (accessed through the state portal) are *unofficial* and *will not update with final scores* due to carried domains. Decisions about retaining or exiting English learner status should be made based on finalized score reports found in official ODE data applications such as Secure Assessment Reports.

District Test Coordinators may download or review records in the ARUA to edit accommodation or administration codes (see the <u>Test Administration Manual</u>, Appendix C).
