■ ELPA21**Updated Guidance: LEP flags for Exited ELs**

As described in Appendix B of the [Test Administration Manual](#), only students who are currently designated as ELs or who were reclassified from ELD services after February 2, 2017 are eligible to take ELPA21. In the [February 16 issue of the A&A Update](#), ODE included a reminder that all eligible students must have their LEP flag set to Yes (Y) in ODE's SSID system (which will then populate student data in TIDE) in order to access ELPA21. At that time, ODE indicated that all other students, including those students who were reclassified out of the EL program on or before February 2, 2017 must have their LEP flags set to No (N) to ensure they do not inadvertently take ELPA21 when they are not eligible. However, it has since come to ODE's attention that this guidance has caused issues for districts' student information systems and does not align with ADM requirements that states the LEP flag must be set to Y for students if they were designated as an EL student at any point during the current school year.

Updated guidance: Districts should follow the definition rules for the LEP flag located in the Cumulative ADM manual. This means that some students will have the flag set to Y in the SSID system, even though they are no longer eligible to take ELPA21 this year. To ensure that only eligible students access ELPA21, if a student who has been reclassified out of the EL program on or before February 2, 2017 has the LEP flag set to Y in your district's student information system, districts can use the "Blocked Subjects" feature in TIDE to block ELPA21 for these students. District Test Coordinators, District Level Users, and School Test Coordinators can block individual students from ELPA21 through the "Student Settings" page or use the mass upload feature of TIDE to implement a block for multiple students at once (the [TIDE User Guide](#) contains step by step instructions for both approaches). SMARTER BALANCED

Online Reporting System for Smarter Balanced Tests Now Available

Smarter Balanced ELA and Math scores can now be viewed in the Online Reporting System (ORS). Smarter Balanced tests are reported only after a student has completed both the CAT and the PT components. Upon the submission of the second of both segments, it takes an average of 10 business days to complete handscoring. The [2016-2017 Online Reporting System User Guide](#) has been uploaded to assist with any questions regarding ORS.

As a reminder, ORS provides dynamic data that can be used to gauge students' achievement on various assessments. However, the data in this system are not to be used for official accountability purposes. The Oregon Department of Education provides official accountability data.

Professional Development Opportunity: Smarter Balanced Hand Scoring **REPEAT**

Accommodations Flag Now Available in TIDE

For all students on an IEP or 504 plan, federal law requires that districts report whether students receive accommodations (either embedded or non-embedded) on the statewide assessments. Historically, districts have had the option to report this through a "None" or "One or More" Accommodations Flag located in both TIDE and Student Centered Staging. At the beginning of the 2016-17 school year, the Accommodations Flag in TIDE was inadvertently omitted from the Student Settings page of TIDE. However, AIR has now added the Accommodations Flag back to the student settings page of TIDE in the form of a None/One or More dropdown at the bottom of the accommodations section. As in past years, districts may choose

whether to set this flag in TIDE or in Student Centered Staging. The exception is, if a student has already completed a test, the flag on this record must be set in Student Centered Staging.

ANSWERS TO COMMON QUESTIONS FROM THE FIELD

Question: Why can I see students from another school/district in my testing session?

Answer: In Oregon, students are not restricted to testing in their resident district. Students can test in a Test Administrator (TA) session with a TA from any district if the TA approves them to test. Sometimes there are two sessions running concurrently with similar session IDs, and either the TA writes the wrong session ID on the blackboard (perhaps transposing two numerals) or a student types in the wrong ID (perhaps mistyping one letter or numeral). To avoid including a student who should not be testing in your test session, it is important that TAs carefully check all student names before approving students to test.
