# 2024-25 OSAS Statewide Summative Tests in ELA and Math Now Available for Administration in Grades 3 - 8

The statewide test window for administration of the OSAS English Language Arts (ELA) and Math tests (Grades 3 - 8) opened on April 1, 2025.

• The test window is open for all versions of the tests: online General (in-person and remote) and Alternate (Oregon Extended; in-person only).

As a reminder, prior to beginning a test session, verify that appropriate student accommodations and supports have been accurately set in TIDE. See the <u>Oregon Accessibility Manual</u> for more information about accommodations and supports.

The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) has partnered with Smarter Balanced for the development of new ELA Summative Test items. Item writing development will be held online **July 21 - 24, 2025**.

# Summer 2025 OSAS Science Assessment Item Review: Oregon Science Educator Panel Opportunities

This summer, the Oregon Department of Education (ODE), in partnership with our vendor, Cambium Assessment, Inc (CAI), will host three Oregon Science Educator Panels. Below are the panel topics, dates, and application details.

- Multi-State Rubric Validation Panel
   This panel is designed to ensure that assessment scoring is accurate and fair for all students. Participants will review and make recommendations on item scoring and potential rubric adjustments. This panel is completely virtual and will be held in the evenings during the weeks of May 19-22, and June 2-5, 2025. Participants can register for two sessions.
   Applications are due by 5:00 pm on Friday, April 18, 2025.
- Multi-State Content and Fairness Review Panel Participants will analyze assessment items for alignment to standards, grade-level appropriateness, fairness, potential bias, sensitivity issues, and other quality criteria. This panel is completely virtual and will be held during July 8-10, 2025 (three-day commitment). Stay tuned—more information and application details will be available soon!
- Multi-State Data Review Panel This panel will examine statistical flags and item parameter data to identify potentially problematic content. Educators will review flagged items to determine if they should proceed to operational tests or require adjustments. This panel is completely virtual and will be held in the evenings during the week of August 25-28, 2025. Participants can register for two sessions.
   Applications are due by 5:00 pm Friday, April 18, 2025.

### **ELPA Summative and Alt ELPA Batch 2 Scores Available**

English Language Proficiency Assessment (ELPA) scores from February 2025 (batch 2) will be available in the Assessment Record Updating Application (ARUA) on the ODE <u>secure district website</u> and also in the Centralized Reporting System (CRS) on the OSAS Portal as of **Tuesday, April 8.** 

Test scores for students participating in <u>Honoring Student Proficiency on the HS ELPA Summative</u> are final as of Tuesday, April 8. As a reminder, this means that a high school student's Proficient performance on one or more domains from a prior year will be inserted into this year's test, and scoring for remaining non-exempted domains will complete using that Proficient performance. **Please note** that scores appearing in the Centralized Reporting System (accessed through the state portal) are *unofficial* and *will not update with final scores* due to carried domains. Decisions about retaining or exiting English Learner status should be made based on finalized score reports found in official ODE data applications such as AWE and Secure Assessment Reports.

District Test Coordinators may download or review records in the ARUA to edit accommodation or administration codes (see the <u>Test Administration Manual</u>, Appendix C). If you have questions or need assistance with your assessment data, please contact your <u>Regional ESD Partner</u>.

### 2024-25 New School Status Requests Due May 1, 2025

Oregon Department of Education annually provides schools an opportunity to request that the Accountability Detail Sheets take into account boundary changes due to modifications to attendance areas, restructuring of schools (e.g., consolidation, separation, etc.), or changes to grade configurations. Schools should use the <a href="Boundary Change Calculator for 2024-25 Accountability Reports">Boundary Change Calculator for 2024-25 Accountability Reports</a> to request New School status if they experience a significant change in student enrollment between school years.

If you feel that it would be appropriate to request New School status, please visit the <u>Accountability Details</u> webpage under the "Tools" menu to access 2024-25 Boundary Change Calculator and other pertinent information.

Please submit required materials for New School Status by **May 1, 2025**. ODE will respond with a decision concerning the request by mid-June.

## QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

### **ESSA Test Administration Monitoring**

The **Self-Assessment is now available**, and information has been shared with District Test Coordinators in districts and ESDs being monitored this year. Here's a quick guide to help clarify the monitoring cycle:

**QUESTION:** What is the monitoring cycle?

ANSWER: Districts will participate in ESSA Test Administration Monitoring once every five years. The first 5-year monitoring cycle begins in Spring 2025. This initial cycle follows this schedule: Year 1: 2025, Year 2: 2026, Year 3: 2027, Year 4: 2028, Year 5: 2029.

QUESTION: What if I'm unsure which year my district falls into?

**ANSWER:** You can refer to the <u>ESSA Test Administration Monitoring Rotation of Districts</u> document to determine which year your district or ESD is assigned within this first cycle.
