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GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

Speech-To-Text for Spring 2019 and 2019-20

Reminder: Students needing Speech-to-Text (STT) must use Windows or Mac machines running permissive mode and use the third party STT software available in their district. Please refer to the <u>Technical</u> <u>Specifications Manual</u> on the <u>OSAS Portal</u> for more information.

In 2017-18, ODE published a workaround to enable STT using dictation on iPads in the <u>Oregon Accessibility Manual (OAM)</u>. Due to changes in Apple's operating system, this workaround is no longer available.

ELPA Summative Test Window Closing

The ELPA Summative test window will close for the 2018-19 school year at **11:59 p.m. PT on Friday, April 12**. All ELPA Summative tests that have not been completed or submitted at that time will be force submitted on April 13.

Updated List of Dyslexia Screeners

Oregon school districts are required to universally screen for risk factors of dyslexia in kindergarten (and any first grade student newly enrolled in an Oregon public school in first grade) using a test identified by the Oregon Department of Education (ODE). In June of 2018, ODE released a list of approved universal screening tools for risk factors of dyslexia. Districts began implementing the screening requirement in the 2018-

2019 school year. Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR 581-002-1820) requires that ODE annually review and update this <u>list of approved</u> <u>universal screeners for risk factors of dyslexia</u>. To be included on this list, a screener must meet the following criteria:

- Have strong predictive validity, classification accuracy and norm-referenced scoring.
- Include measures of all of the following areas at least once per year in kindergarten:
 - Phonological awareness;
 - Letter-sound correspondences; and
 - Rapid naming.

- Include measures of all of the following areas at least once per year in first grade:
 - Phonological awareness;
 - Letter-sound correspondences;
 - Rapid naming;
 - Word or pseudo word reading fluency; and
 - Oral reading fluency.
- Include options for progress monitoring measures.
- Be cost effective.

In February and March of 2019, ODE completed an internal review process that resulted in the addition of a new screener to the list: DIBELS 8th Edition (along with the tablet version of DIBELS 8th Edition: mCLASS: DIBELS 8th).

As part of the annual review process, ODE requested that test publishers provide information on accessibility supports or accommodations available for students taking each screener. The <u>Accessibility Supports for Universal Screeners</u> resource provides a list of approved accommodations, a description of each and recommendations for use (including appropriate measures) for each of the approved dyslexia screeners. Districts can make decisions regarding accommodations for individual students based on these allowable accommodations submitted by the publishers.

English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics Results Now Available

Results for students who have completed the English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics assessments (both Computer Adaptive Test and Performance Task) are now available in the Online Reporting System (ORS). Scores will be released daily as completed tests are scored. If you have any questions about the results or viewing reports in ORS, please access the <u>ORS User Guide</u>, available on the OSAS Portal, or contact the <u>OSAS Helpdesk</u>.

Scores for ELA and Mathematics tests are available in Student Centered Staging, Secure Assessment Reports, and the Accountability Warehouse Extract (AWE) application as of April 2. ELA and Mathematics assessments are reported only after a student has completed both parts (the CAT and the PT) and all questions have been scored. It takes up to two weeks after a Performance Task is completed for all questions to be scored and for the two parts of the test to be combined and reported.
