Essential Skills Option for English Learners: OAR Amendment REPEAT

Policy Update

An EL student pursuing a diploma in 2017-2018 or 2018-2019 may demonstrate proficiency in the reading and/or writing Essential Skills in the student's language of origin as long as the student:

- is on track to meet all other graduation requirements;
- is unable to demonstrate proficiency in the Essential Skills in English; and
- has been enrolled in a U.S. school for five years or fewer.

The OAR amendment suspends the minimum English language proficiency criterion for students seeking a diploma in 2017-2018 or 2018-2019, and this suspension will sunset on August 31, 2019.

ELPA21 Batch 2 Test Records Available April 10, 2018

Batch 2 ELPA21 scores from February 2018 will be posted in Student Centered Staging, Accountability Warehouse Extract (AWE), and Secure Assessment Reports 2.0 (SAR) on the ODE <u>secure district website</u> and also in OAKS Online Reports (ORS) on the <u>OAKS Portal</u> on **Tuesday, April 10**.

District Test Coordinators may download or review records in Student Centered Staging to edit accommodation or administration codes (see the <u>Test Administration Manual</u>, Appendix C). **Please note** that there is a one-day lag for changes to test records in Student Centered Staging (district edits or newly loaded records) to be available in the Warehouse applications (AWE and SAR).

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Answers to Common Questions from the Field

QUESTION: The new Science tasks seem to address practices, DCI, and cross-cutting concepts, or at least two of the three, but are we asking students to do too many things in each problem?

ANSWER: The task design of items allows students an opportunity to demonstrate the synthesis required of three-dimensional standards that several single dimension items added together cannot demonstrate.

The Board on Testing and Assessment (NRC) concluded: (2-1) "Measuring the three-dimensional science learning called for in the framework and the Next Generation Science Standards requires assessment tasks that examine students' performance of scientific and engineering practices in the context of disciplinary core ideas and crosscutting concepts. To adequately cover the three dimensions, assessment tasks will generally need to contain multiple components (e.g., a set of interrelated questions)." (2-4) "Assessment tasks that attempt to test practices in strict isolation from one another may not be meaningful as assessments of the three-dimensional science learning called for by the NGSS."
