ELPA Braille Form Order Window Now Open

The English Language Proficiency Assessment (ELPA) is available in a paper/pencil Braille format. To order, District Test Coordinators should complete the 2019-20 Braille Order Form. The same form is used to order both the ELPA Screener and the ELPA Summative. Summative orders should be submitted by **October 1, 2019**; Screener orders may be placed at any time.

KINDERGARTEN ASSESSMENT

2019-20 Kindergarten Assessment Braille Order Form

The 2019-20 Kindergarten Assessment Braille Order Form is now available online and districts may place their order at any time through October 3, 2019. Districts should keep their local Kindergarten Assessment test window in mind when ordering Braille forms to ensure that they are able to complete testing within the first six weeks of the district's school year. Once a district places their order, ODE will work with the regional Special Education program and Teacher for the Visually Impaired (TVI) assigned to support the student to locally emboss copies of the student booklets and districts should allow up to 5 business days for processing after placing their order.

Please note that ODE does not accept orders for Large Print versions of the student booklets. The standard version of the

Third Period Cumulative Average Daily Membership (ADM) Audit Window Change REPEAT

Due to an issue in the collection application that caused an error for a handful of districts, the Audit Window for Third Period Cumulative ADM has been changed to **open on June 6, 2019 at 1pm and run through the end of the day Monday, June 17, 2019**. At that time, the Third Period Cumulative ADM collection will be reopened for all districts to review your audits for accuracy and make any additional changes that were missed during the collection window. This change in the window will also push the second round audits back an additional week.

Regular Attenders Validation Opens Thursday, June 6

The Regular Attenders Validation (formerly known as the Not Chronically Absent Validation) will open today, Thursday, June 6 at 1 PM and remain open through **August 23**. Once your district has finished submitting and reviewing your Third Period Cumulative ADM Submission, please log into the Regular Attenders Validation through the <u>Achievement Data Insight (ADI) Application</u> to review your data. The percent of students who are regular attenders is a measure of the number of students who were present more than 90% of the days they were enrolled. It will be reported on the <u>School and District At-a-Glance Profiles</u>, and is part of a <u>standalone report</u>.

Student Centered Staging to Close for Processing June 7 - 10

Student Centered Staging is open for editing 2018-19 test records until **5 PM on Friday, June 7** and is scheduled to reopen for editing by 9 AM on **Tuesday, June 11**. The 2018-19 subjects will also be unavailable in Secure Assessment Reports during this time. After June 11, Student Centered Staging 2018-19 subjects will not close again until **August 23**.

Staging Components Completed:

- Oregon Extended Assessment records (English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science) are available as of May 24. District Test Coordinators who wish to view or download records for students who took an Extended Assessment in 2018-19 may select the Test Type "Extended Assessments" when searching for records in Student Centered Staging, Accountability Warehouse Extract (AWE) or Secure Assessment Reports (SAR).
- Virtual records have been created that indicate non-participation of required English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics assessments based on data submitted in the Third Period Cumulative ADM collection for enrollment on May 1, 2019. A virtual record is created for the student if there is not a valid test in the required content areas as described by the grade of enrollment in the ADM collection. **NOTE:** about 80% of the ELA and 70% of math test records are currently loaded, so there are more virtual records at this time that will be deleted as we receive and process the remaining ELA and math records.
- Accountability flags (such as RCSchlPartic, RCSchlPerf and ParticSchlInstID) have been filled on all test
 records that were loaded by Friday, May 31 and indicate which tests are used for accountability reporting.
 These fields are not available in the Student Centered Staging download file, but the full set of fields are
 available through the Accountability Warehouse Extract (AWE) Assessment Student Extract or Bulk
 Download option. PLEASE NOTE that there is a one-day lag for changes to test records in Student Centered
 Staging (district edits or newly loaded records) to be available in the Warehouse applications (AWE and
 Secure Assessment Reports).
- Student group information such as race/ethnicity, special education, and other program flags have been
 filled on all test records that were loaded by Friday, May 31 from Third Period Cumulative ADM for students
 enrolled on the first school day in May (except the Migrant Education Flag, which is filled from the Oregon
 Migrant Student Information System, and the Homeless Flag, which is filled from the Summer Homeless
 collection). For more information on How to Edit Demographic and Program Fields and the Student

Staging Components Not Yet Completed:

- Identification of students as current English Learners (in the LEPFg field), and virtual ELPA records based on records submitted in the Title III: English Learners collection (to be completed by **June 11, 2019**)
- Social Sciences tests partially completed (aka "Partials") (to be completed by June 21, 2019)
- English Language Arts and Mathematics tests taken mid-May through June 7 (to be completed by June 28, 2019)
- English Language Arts and Mathematics tests partially completed (aka "Partials") (to be completed by July 5, 2019)

If you do not have access to Student Centered Staging, Accountability Warehouse Extract, or Secure Assessment Reports applications, please contact your <u>district security administrator</u>.

Be sure to resolve errors before downloading or reviewing records online so that the data is as accurate as possible. Please contact your <u>Regional ESD Partner</u> for more information or for assistance accessing assessment records.

Achievement Data Insight Validations Opening June 13

The Assessment validations (English Language Arts and Mathematics) will open on the afternoon of **June 13**. These validations will remain open through **August 23**. The validations are accessible through the <u>Achievement Data Insight</u> (ADI) application. Contact your <u>district security administrator</u> if you do not have access to the application, or if you do not see these validations once you access the application.

Please review your data during this window. No changes to the underlying data will be allowed after August 23.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Answers to Common Questions from the Field

QUESTION: May a district purchase an assessment and use it as a Local Assessment Option for the purpose of Essential Skills?

ANSWER: No, the district must develop the assessment for it to qualify as a *Local Assessment Option*. A test that was already developed may not be purchased by a district and called a *Local Assessment Option*. Tests or item banks that are available for purchase must be evaluated as *Other Standardized Assessment* options and these evaluations have a formal process and culminate in a decision by the State Board of Education.

The <u>Essential Skills Manual</u> includes a section on the *Local Assessment Option* (pages 21-27) that explains that districts must use the established professional and technical standards for the development of a *Local Assessment Option*. This is a very sophisticated and specialized set of standards and a district should consider whether they have the expertise in their district to meet these standards before embarking on the process.
