High School Test Scheduling Flexibility

In response to stakeholder feedback gathered in the spring of 2018 surrounding our high school summative accountability assessments, the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) has removed the requirement that schools wait until at least 66% of the school year's instructional days have passed before administering the statewide high school summative math and ELA tests to 11th graders. New for 2018-19, schools may schedule administration of the statewide high school summative tests throughout the duration of the statewide test window, which opens on January 8, 2019. ODE first communicated this policy change in Executive Numbered Memo 001-2018-19 on July 11, 2018, and ODE will also reflect this change in the final 2018-19 Test Administration Manual when it is published on October 1, 2018. ODE will study the impact of allowing this additional test scheduling flexibility at the end of the school year in order to determine what additional flexibility might be appropriate to address stakeholder needs in future years.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Answers to Common Questions from the Field

QUESTION: If a student takes the ELPA screener, does that student still have to take the ELPA summative test?

ANSWER: Yes. The ELPA screener serves to identify which students may be eligible for ELD services. The ELPA summative helps determine which students are ready to exit an ELD program. These are two different tests that serve two different purposes.
