TEST ADMINISTRATION

OSAS Remote Testing Resources Available

ODE will continue providing a remote testing option for the OSAS Summative Tests, OSAS Interim Tests, and SEED Survey. ODE has updated communication and training resources on the [ODE Test Administration](#) web page under the “Remote Testing Resources” menu. Educators administering assessments or surveys remotely must complete the following training requirements:

- Module 10: Remote Testing (located on the [Training Materials page](#));
- The Remote Test Administration Certification Course (located on the [OSAS Portal: Test Administrators page](#)).

As a reminder, schools must receive permission from families prior to student participation in any remote testing session. Once a school has received permission for remote testing, the TIDE Student Settings for that individual must be updated to allow for remote participation.

INTERIM ASSESSMENT

2022-2023 Interim Assessments Now Available **REPEAT**

The statewide test window for the Oregon Interim Assessments in ELA, Math, and Science is now open for the 2022-2023 school year. Schools and districts may administer these assessments to students in-person or remotely. Information and professional learning resources to support test selection, administration, scoring, and data use are available on ODE’s [Interim Assessment webpage](#).

Oregon’s interim assessment blocks are best used to provide educators and students with feedback about how well students have learned content that has just been provided by instruction. They are also aligned to content across the full depth, breadth, and complexity of Oregon’s standards, including requiring students to write independently and to explain their math reasoning.

As a reminder, [Training Module 8 - Interims: Remote Administration and Test Security](#) is required for all educators to complete before their District Test Coordinator (DTC) provides user role access to the Interim Assessment System.

- If an educator has completed the 2021-22 TA requirements, they will only need to provide evidence they have completed Module 8.
- If an educator did not have a TA user account from the 2021-22 instructional year or if the educator has transitioned to a new district which is different from last year, they must:
 - Complete the reading requirements in Table 5 of the Test Administration Manual
 - Complete Module 8
 - And complete training Modules 2, 3, and 4 available on the ODE Test Administration, [Assessment Training Materials Page](#).
