Password Resets Unavailable Saturday, October 20

The system that sends confirmation emails when Single Sign-On passwords are reset will undergo maintenance from **1 to 4 p.m. PT on Saturday, October 20**. Users will be unable to reset their password during this time. The Test Delivery System (TDS), TIDE, and the Online Reporting System (ORS) will remain available during this maintenance activity.

2018-2019 Smarter Balanced Interim/Benchmark Assessments Now Available

The Smarter Balanced Interim/Benchmark Assessments and Digital Library Resources are now available for the 2018-2019 school year. District or schools who are participating in the pilot or have purchased the interim assessments may now administer these assessments to students using the Secure Browser. Links to all of the systems and resources needed to administer the interim assessments are available by clicking "2018-19 Interim Pilot or Purchase" on the OSAS Portal homepage. For districts and schools that have not purchased the interim assessment this year, no action is needed and their test administration will not be impacted. Deadline for 2018-19 DTC Training Modules and Survey is November 2

As a reminder, to satisfy the 2018-19 District Test Coordinator (DTC) training requirements, all DTCs must:

- Watch the 2018-19 DTC training modules by November 2;
- Complete the 2018-19 Training Quiz by November 2; and
- Participate in one of the ODE-facilitated <u>Webinar sessions</u> scheduled for **November 6 – 8**.

If you have not already watched the training modules and submitted your survey response, please make time to complete these requirements by November 2. ODE will use the survey responses to track who has watched the required modules and to develop the curriculum for the ODE-facilitated Webinar sessions. TIDE Student Search Results & Multiple Institution Associations for Users

When TIDE opened for the 2018-19 school year on October 2, ODE communicated that two features were not yet available:

- The Test Windows features is not yet available for summative ELA and Math assessments
- Some of the columns in Student search results are categorized incorrectly under Embedded Accommodations and Embedded Designated Supports

As an update, the columns in TIDE Student search results are now correctly categorized under Embedded Accommodations and Embedded Designated Supports. In addition, districts may now add multiple institution associations for a single user via the Add Users module. Districts may also continue to add multiple institution associations to a single user via the Upload Users module. Summative ELA and Math assessments are expected to be available in the Test Windows feature by November 19.

Release of At-A-Glance School and District Profiles

The public release of the new At-A-Glance School and District Profiles and the Accountability Details Reports is **Thursday, November 15 at 8 a.m**. At that time the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) will post the English and Spanish At-A-Glance profiles and the suppressed version of the Accountability Details on the reports page.

A New Approach

The new at-a-glance profile was developed with extensive input from Oregon families including families of historically underserved students. Their ideas fell into three key areas:

- Information about how their child's school or district creates a welcoming, safe and inclusive environment for all students and their families
- A design that is simple, multi-colored and easy to read and understand
- A profile that emphasizes progress through relevant and actionable school-specific data

This input led to a redesign that includes graphics showing how a school or district compares to the statewide average in categories like chronic absenteeism, graduation rates, average class size and more.

All of these changes are part of Oregon's Plan that emphasizes partnership and shared accountability for student outcomes. We are excited to officially present these profiles next month.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Answers to Common Questions from the Field

QUESTION: I need to add a record to my Cumulative ADM Exit Adjustment for a student who received a summer diploma. How do I do this?

ANSWER: If the student received their diploma before July 1, 2018 and the student was enrolled immediately prior to receiving the diploma, you can edit the appropriate fields in the Exit Adjustment through Record Management, Record Maintenance. If the student received their diploma before July 1, 2018 and the student was not enrolled immediately prior to receiving the diploma, you will need to contact your Regional ESD Partner or the Cumulative ADM data owner to have them re-open 2017-18 Annual Cumulative ADM, so that you can submit a program type 14 record. If the student received their diploma on or after July 1, 2018, submit this credential using a program type 14 record in First Period Cumulative ADM.
