

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Updates

- Starting August 1, 2023, students use their last names to log into the state testing platform for inclusivity and safety.
 - Must exactly match information in TIDE.
 - Share protocol ideas via this <u>Google Form</u>, closing on October 31st.
- OSAS Interim test window now open.
- Districts must now make the SEED Survey available to all students grades 3-11. Alt SEED grades 3-8 & 11. SEED Survey Administration Manual projected to be published by the end of October.

Testing Impropriety Report Reminders

Err on the side of more detail rather than less. For example:

- "The test ended" could mean...
 - Student accidentally submitted the test by pressing the End Test button
 - TA accidentally ended the test by marking the student as a non-participant
 - The test expired and was automatically submitted before the student finished
 - Something else

Each of the situations above may require different action regarding the student's test record. Incorrect or insufficient information **increases the chance of error** regarding the student's test record.

Reporting form

District Assessment Inventory Update

District Assessment Inventory (HB 4124) page now available.

DTCs will designate a "point of contact".

- ODE will grant the point of contact access to the district's individual Inventory form (the submission tool)
- The point of contact chooses whether to invite others into the form; completing the form may be collaborative, or information may flow through a single person

Please complete the Inventory by EOD January 8, 2024.

A communication with additional information was released on October 5, 2023.

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OSAS Math Test Updates & Changes

- Spanish/ English language toggle is here!
- Transitional Grade 11 Math CAT blueprint in 2023-24 → now published, with FAQ!
 - Four assessment targets eliminated via 2021 Oregon Math Standards
 - Reduced item pool
 - Rebalanced items across targets
- No changes to Grade 11 Math PT
- Sample Grade 11 Math CAT updated when sample tests refresh (31 October)
- No changes to HS interims
- No changes to scoring or reporting
- No changes to Grade 3-8 OSAS Math Test blueprints

Question 1: For the SEED Survey, is there a participation target?

- HB 2656 requires that districts "make available to the students of the school district" the SEED Survey.
- There is no % participation target indicated in HB 2656
- ODE is still operationalizing what it means to "make available" and that information will be included in the SEED Survey Administration Manual.

Question 2: Do parents need to "opt out" in advance?

- HB 2656 states that "parents or guardians must be allowed to decline, either verbally or in writing, to have their children participate in" the SEED Survey.
- SEED survey participation is NOT governed by the ELA & Math opt-out or the Science & ELPA exemption rules.
- Specific timelines related to parent/guardian declining participation will be included in the SEED Survey Administration Manual.
- ODE will provide participation forms that districts may use to help facilitate this process.

Question 3: Is there guidance on deciding which students will get Alt SEED?

- The Alt SEED is available for students in grades 3-8 and 11 experiencing significant cognitive disabilities [see <u>SEED Survey Brief Overview</u>].
- The Alt SEED is completed by an adult familiar with the student's educational experience through the ORK12Test platform.
- The Alt SEED will only be completed for students who are eligible to participate in the ORExt Assessment.

Question 4: Should the district update its crisis paper protocols to include SEED?

- The same crisis alert system that our test vendor (CAI) applies to our assessments is applied to the SEED Survey.
- More details about the new crisis alert process will be provided at the November DTC Annual Webinar.
