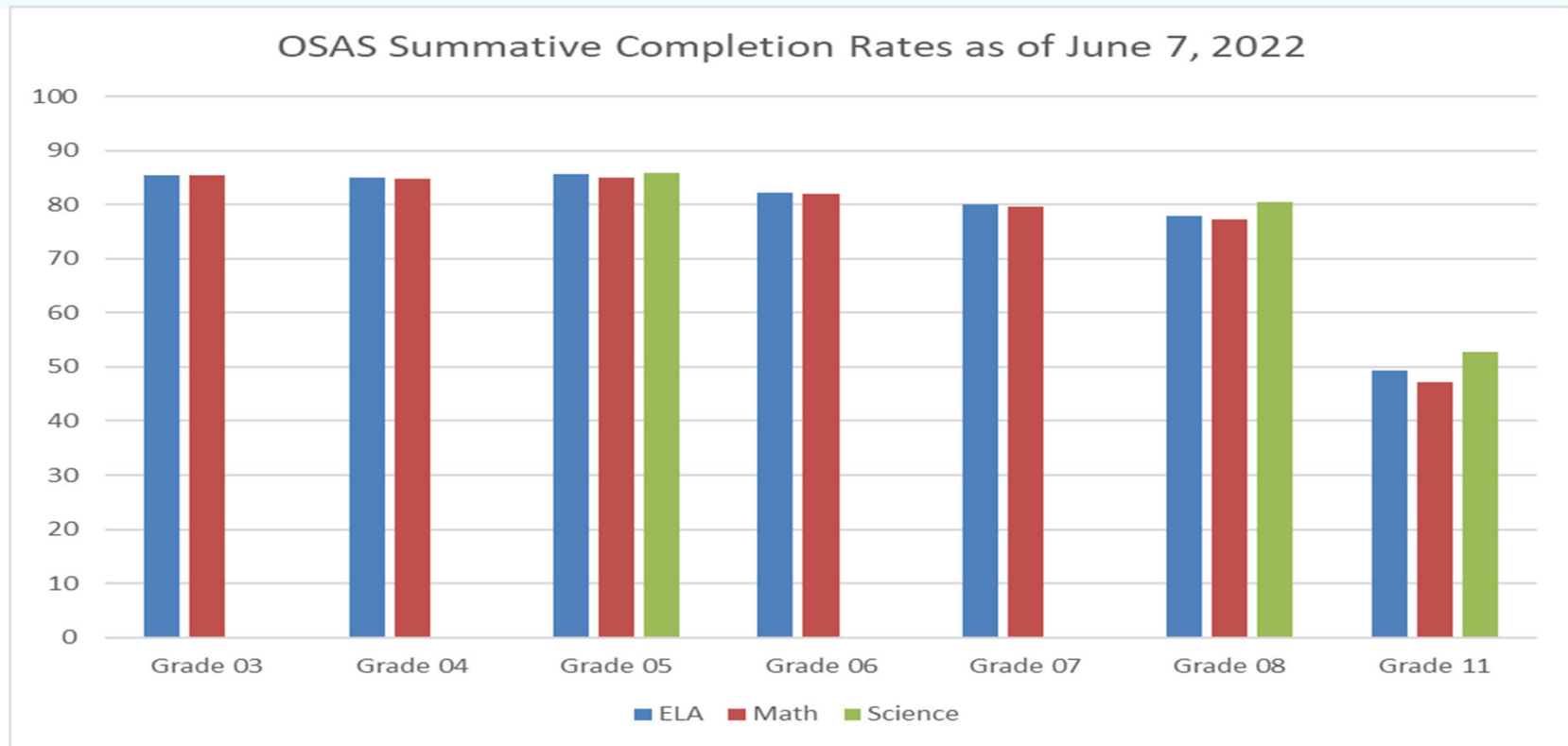
# Announcements & Reminders

# Update

- ELA, Math, and Science summative participation (as of June 7):
  - Grades 3-8: ~75-85% of eligible students completed testing
  - Grade 11: ~50% of eligible students completed testing

**Question 1:** How does the extension of the OSAS window to 6/17/22 impact all the accountability and validation dates, and the dates for getting partials and virtual records?

- The Assessment Validations will open on the planned date: June 9 at 1 PM.
- The Virtual records will be available for editing starting Tuesday, June 7 at 9 AM.
- The Partial records will be loaded two weeks later than their previously scheduled dates.

## **Question 2:** How do we close out the year? What are the “must dos” and by when?

**Question 3:** What are the rules for school-specific test windows? Are there other considerations from what is in the TAM? For example, what are the consequences if a school tests a student outside of their window?

Individual schools are able to develop a testing window that best meets their local needs.

There are no consequences as long as the school testing window or the student's participation in the assessment aligns to the test window dates within Appendix A: Oregon Statewide Summative Test Schedule.
