Alt ELPA and ELPA

- 1. Will an Alt ELPA Screener be available in 2024-25? If yes, what is the timeline for documentation, training, implementation?
 - a. ODE has not yet signed on to participate in any field test of an additional English language proficiency screener.
- 2. In what grades would the new "Provisionally Proficient" ELPA result apply? On what tests?
 - a. If this proficiency designation is approved, it will apply to Grade K-12 ELPA Summative tests only.
- 3. How do you report an ELPA Summative impropriety?
 - a. The DTC should fill out the <u>Test Impropriety and Irregularity Initial</u> <u>Report Form</u>, which is found on the <u>Test Administration page</u>, in the Forms pulldown.

PreACT

- 4. What are the district requirements for administering or making available the PreACT?
 - a. ORS 329.488 directs ODE to provide a statewide opportunity for eligible Oregon 10th grade students enrolled in a public school to access a nationally-normed college entrance practice exam. That practice exam is the PreACT. Districts need to schedule a specific time or times to administer the test during the school day and not during a time that competes with instruction. Local school districts can decide how and when to schedule this opportunity. For example, some districts schedule by administering on a specific day in October, while others have scheduled in the spring. Additionally, this is not an "opt-in" administration for only students whose families choose to take the assessment.

- 5. Will the PreACT window in 2024-25 be similar to the 2023-24 window?
 - a. Yes. We're reviewing the dates as part of the Assessment Calendar process and will share the window as soon as it's been confirmed.
- 6. If I had access to order PreACT materials, does that mean I completed the enrollment process?
 - a. It's likely that you have completed the enrollment process. Please confirm with ACT via their customer service email:
 <u>PreACT@act.org</u>. ESD Partners have also been reaching out to districts who have not completed the enrollment process, as well.

SEED

- 7. Is the SEED intro script available (or going to be available) in Spanish?
 - a. For this year's administration, the SEED intro script is not available in Spanish. We welcome feedback for suggestions for next year.

 Use the <u>Google form</u> at the bottom of the SEED Survey web page.
- 8. What are "user group permissions" and how do they apply to the SEED?
 - a. See page 15 of the <u>TIDE User Guide</u>. Test groups must be selected to administer the Math, ELA, Science, or ELPA. No test group is needed for the SEED Survey.
- 9. Can we translate the SEED script ourselves?
 - a. Yes, per page 13 of the OAM, translating test directions and test navigation is considered a non-embedded designated support.
- 10. Can students decline to participate in the SEED Survey at the beginning of the survey?
 - a. Yes. If you want to see this item for yourself, consult ODE's <u>SEED</u> <u>Survey webpage</u>.
- 11. Do we need to submit a list of students/families who declined SEED Survey participation to ODE at the end of the year?
 - a. See the <u>SEED Survey Administration Manual</u>, pg. 13. At this time, there is no established goal for SEED survey participation, and districts will not be expected to submit test administration codes

- or other data quality corrections via the Assessment Record Updating Application (ARUA).
- 12. Are districts able to monitor SEED survey participation in TIDE during the survey window?
 - a. See the <u>SEED Survey Administration Manual</u>, pg. 13. Districts may monitor SEED survey completion through the Test Information Distribution Engine (TIDE). Please refer to pages 31-36 of the <u>TIDE</u> <u>User Guide</u> for options on how to monitor survey completion.

Student Health Survey

- 13. When is the Student Health Survey administered? Where can districts find info on administration and a user manual?
 - a. The 2024 administration of the Student Health Survey will occur in the fall of 2024. Write the following address for information about administration and a user manual:

- 14. Is the Student Health Survey yearly, by law?
 - a. Yes. For more information please reach out to Oregon Health Authority: StudentHealth.Survey@dhsoha.state.or.us
- 15. Is the Student Health Survey required for all schools?
 - a. The Student Health Survey and the SEED Survey, per HB 2656, must be made available to all students in Oregon. Districts must offer both surveys during a time during the school day when no other instruction is occurring.

Other

- 16. Will DTC's get a copy of their district's District Assessment Inventory Form?
 - a. Every district will have an opportunity to re-access their Inventory Form.
- 17. How long do we need to keep documentation of student opt outs?

a. Districts must retain non-federally required student records, such as parent-submitted opt-out forms, for at least three years after the record was created.
