ELPA

- 1. A lot of information was shared about domain exemption procedures during today's webinar. Is that information available anywhere else? Will more be shared?
 - a. Abbreviated instructions for districts are available in the TAM. A fuller explanation will be added to existing guidance.
- 2. Will changes to how domain exemptions are entered in TIDE affect domains carried under <u>Honoring Student Proficiency on the ELPA</u> <u>Summative and Alt ELPA</u>?
 - a. There will be no changes. Carried domains will not be presented to the student, just as in previous years.

ELTC

- 2. Even though we anticipate that the ELTC will be piloted again in 2026-27, how should districts not yet in the pilot prepare for statewide implementation?
 - a. The ELTC will likely continue in pilot during the 2026–27 school year. ODE and DELC are building the necessary infrastructure with existing funding and will continue to promote the Family Conversation with partners and advocate for additional funding. We will keep districts updated throughout the pilot process and answer any questions that arise.
 - b. Districts interested in learning how to begin planning are invited to join an <u>informational session</u> on October 29 from 3:30 to 5:00 p.m. PST.

- 4. When will the 2024-25 data be publicly released?
 - a. The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) will publicly release the 2025 Oregon Statewide Assessment data at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, October 2, 2025.

- 6. Will there be an ORExt 1% Meeting this year?

 - a. The Oregon Accessibility Panel is a required panel that will remain. The Alternate Assessment Advisory Panel is not required and was recently convened.
