Alternate Assessments

Q: Has the Alt ELPA Admin Manual been posted yet?

A: The Alt ELPA User Guide will be available by the end of November. It will be posted on the [ELP Assessment page](#) under the Alt ELPA section as well as in the resources section of the [OSAS portal](#).

Q: During the webinar, you mentioned that Dictation (Math) was updated in the OAM. Where was it previously listed?

A: Dictation (Embedded Speech-to-Text) was previously listed as an embedded accommodation for both math & ELA assessments. It is now listed as an embedded designated support for math and remains an embedded accommodation for ELA.

Early Learning Check-in/Kindergarten

Q: How much time will school districts need to carve out in their school/district calendars to accommodate family interviews?

A: Prior to the fall 2022 pilot, ODE had several conversations with Oregon school districts that have been implementing family interviews for a number of years. Some districts repurposed the soft start week and met with families. While others used a hybrid schedule for a couple of weeks. No two school districts approached scheduling family interviews alike. Interim Assessment

Q: Is the LPA the same as a "work sample?"


A: Many districts will use the term “work sample” to refer to that Local Performance Assessment activity. Please refer to the [Essential Skills and Local Performance Assessment Manual](#) for additional information and guidance.

Q: Which interim assessments qualify as an LPA, and which do not?

A: ELA and Math: only the interim assessment [Performance Tasks](#).
Science: only the interim assessment [cluster Tasks](#) that align to the grade level content (refer to the [Science Interim Assessment Overview](#)).

Q: You said MAP and iReady don't qualify as LPA, but there was another one you listed. Can you share the third app?

A: Easy CBM. As a reminder: *Local Performance Assessment development should emphasize building activities, exercises, or problems that get at higher depth of knowledge and cognitive*


complexity, as the tasks must evaluate the student's ability to apply their knowledge, rather than just recall or demonstrate.

Q: Is it still true that districts can submit their own LPAs for approval?

A: ODE does not review or approve district LPAs.
