Test Improprieties

Q: How are test improprieties reported for OR Extended assessments?

A: Use the same <u>Test Impropriety and Irregularity Initial Report Form</u> that is used for all other test impropriety reports. Because the verbal answer to this question may not have been sufficiently specific, we will repeat: *all* test improprieties and irregularities for *any* statewide test should flow through the <u>Test Impropriety and Irregularity Initial Report Form</u>.

Q: I have a question about a student who has domain exemptions set in TIDE but is still seeing questions in those domains. Do I report this as impropriety?

A: No, please contact the <u>OSAS Helpdesk</u> immediately to get support. Please make sure to have all the important information to share and an outline of the situation (e.g. we exempted this domain and yet, we are still seeing items from this domain).

Testing

Q: I am having trouble with the testing site. We used to put in two tests at once and now It won't let us do more than one test at a time. Help.

A: Contact your regional ESD partner or the OSAS Helpdesk.

Q: I heard there might be an issue with subject blocking. Is that true?

A: Blocking is working on all in-person tests. If you are experiencing technical issues with blocking, contact the <u>OSAS Helpdesk</u>. It is also important to verify blocking has been set prior to a student logging into their test.

• Please note: Blocking <u>does not work on **remote ELPA**</u>, but will work on all other remote tests: ELA, Math, and Science.
