## **Oregon Professional Development Opportunity: ELA and Mathematics Summative Test Scoring**



The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) is seeking educators interested in participating in the scoring of ELA and Mathematics test items for Oregon Statewide Summative Tests.

- This opportunity to participate in summative test scoring is primarily intended for individuals who would like to deepen their understanding of hand-scored items and the rubrics used to score them.
- As part of ODE's collaboration with Measurement Incorporated (MI), applicants will be signed on as temporary employees with MI and will receive compensation at the standard ODE rate of \$40.94 per hour.
- Applicants will need to apply for either ELA or mathematics scoring.

**NOTE:** There are minimum technical requirements to install and run the scoring platform. For instance, the scoring platform <u>does not</u> run properly on ChromeOS.

The initial training for this project will occur on Monday, March 4, 2024, in Salem, OR. Substitute and travel costs for the March 4<sup>th</sup> training day will be reimbursed based on ODE guidelines.

<u>Following that training day, qualified raters will then commit to scoring items remotely during their own off-contract time throughout spring.</u>

Once completing the training workshop and MI hiring process, you will be added to the scoring pool.

- If you are an ELA participant, you may end up training to score student responses in a different ELA content category (reading, writing, or research). \*
- If you are a math participant, you may be scoring different math grade-levels from your initial training or than you teach. \*
- \* This is because we cannot predict the workflow for hand-scoring needs, and your flexibility helps ensure that you will have something to score after training.

**Scoring Schedules:** We ask that you choose a scoring schedule with consistent shifts per week and maintain this schedule to ensure support from MI leadership:

- Each participant is committing to score 2 3 weekday evenings per week, over a four- to six-week period.
  - MI may be able to provide weekend scoring schedules which will be further discussed at the March training.
- Participants will select a hand-scoring shift between 4 12 hours each week based on availability.
  - o Each shift will require <u>a minimum of 2 hours</u> of scoring student responses.

ODE will prioritize selection based on educator and regional diversity, active classroom educators and instructional coaches, grade band scoring needs, and a combination of both new and experienced scoring experience.

The deadline for submitting an <u>application</u> is **Tuesday, February 13, 2024,** and ODE will notify successful applicants by February 16<sup>th</sup> along with information on next steps.
