	Baseline Data	As 4th graders, in the beginning of the year, the TRIALS Assessment of Informational Literacy Skills General Information Literacy Skills showed: 20% scored less than 40% 40% scored between 40-60% 30% scored between 60 and 80%, and 10% scored above 80%.
	Student Growth Goal (Targets)	Based on their performance on the pre-assessment, students will make the following growth by May 2016: Tier 1: Students who scored less than 40% (0-19%) will score 60% or higher on the post-assessment Tier 2: Students who scored 40 – 60% will score 75% or higher Tier 3: Students who scored 60% and above will score 90% or higher and their

		final project will be evaluated using the SBAC Research Rubric for grades 3-5.
	Rationale	As students move into 6 th grade they are required to conduct research and present their findings. In order to be successful, students need to be efficient in their search for information and accurate in their citations. As global citizens they must know where to look for information and cite the sources they use.
	Strategies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide instruction in research methods • Provide instruction in fact vs. opinion • Outline guidelines for identifying valid and reliable resources on the web • Model the writing process emphasizing the difference between paraphrasing and plagiarizing, as well as appropriate citations
