Jeffrey Gibson Venice Biennale 2024 Educator Project

Artist Jeffrey Gibson has been selected to represent the United States in the 2024 Venice Biennale. The Portland Art Museum (PAM) and SITE Santa Fe are the presenting



institutions, providing curatorial and other support to the artist to create the exhibition *the* space in which to place me. One of Gibson's goals is to connect with youth and to make a difference in how Native art and cultures are taught. PAM and SITE Santa Fe are currently seeking collaborators to help make this exhibition accessible and relevant to students and educators in Oregon, New Mexico, and beyond.

PAM and SITE Santa Fe staff will select ten educators from Oregon and New Mexico (five from each region) to engage deeply with the exhibition, including:

- Travel to Venice to see the exhibition and participate in seminars and programs
- Collaborating with each other in the U.S. through both online meetings and travel to Santa Fe and Portland and with a wider educator advisory group
- Developing educator resources and facilitating professional development workshops in Oregon and New Mexico
- (Tentatively) Advising and collaborating with staff at the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian (NMAI) on a digital resource
