What is Measure 98?

Measure 98 was a ballot initiative passed in 2016 by Oregon voters to provide high schools with funding for student success programs.

Funding was to support programming in Dropout Prevention, Career & Technical Education, and College Level Education Opportunities.

Many districts applied for Measure 98 funds to form 9th grade student success teams to support student progress toward graduation.

What are Student Success Teams?

Success team components:

- Ninth grade academic coaches hired and trained
- School-wide data system utilization focused on course-taking patterns, absences, grades, and earned credits
- Counseling, tutoring support, and mechanisms for credit recovery provided to students identified as not on track to graduate

Who are the Project Evaluators?

Partnership:

With support from the Institute for Education Sciences, the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) and the University of Oregon (UO) are collaborating to investigate the impact of student success team implementation on the graduation readiness of 9th grade students.
